

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON AUGUST 13, 1934

The three hundred eighty-eighth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 13th day of August, 1934 in the Council Chambers.

Present: Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Saunders, Shrock and Walsh. Marshal Riley, Water Superintendent Bevington, Recorder Adams, and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the three hundred eighty-seventh regular meeting were read and were approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chiefs report was read and ordered filed.

The Recorder reported that he had interviewed Anna Miller and that she was agreeable to the construction of a sidewalk abutting her property on Harrison Street and would proceed with the construction of the same within the near future.

The Recorder reported that Mrs. Anna Miller had expressed the desire that a drain be established under the roadbed of the Tillamook Branch of the Southern Pacific railroad where same intersects Harrison Street so that surface waters would not flow from the street on to her property during the rainy season. The Recorder was instructed to take the matter up with the Southern Pacific Company

Street Commissioner Bevington reported that Mr. Pace would like the grade of King Street in order that he might construct an approach to the street from his garage at the proper level. City Engineer Jones was instructed to supply Mr. Pace with the proper grade.

The Recorder stated that there were two buyers for Lot 13, Block 1, Brownell Acres, Mr. Sandidge and the First State Bank. It was brought out in the discussion that Mr. Sandidge had offered to buy the property first. It was moved by Sanders and seconded by Shrock that Mr. Sandidge be given the first opportunity to purchase the property. Carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Walsh that Councilman Sanders procure a man with a mower to cut grass on the curbs in the city and that Water Commissioner Bevington use delinquent water users to cut grass which could not be cut by mower. Carried and so ordered.

A letter from Will Knight in reference to the construction of a bridge across Johnson Creek connecting Front Street and west bank of Johnson Creek was read. Mr. Knight pointed out that there would be no way for pedestrians to cross Johnson Creek at that point with the removal of the old interurban trestle. After considerable discussion the matter was turned over to Councilman Dean for investigation.

A complaint was made in reference to the use of a loud speaker at Crystal Lake Park. The matter was referred to Marshal Riley.

Councilman Shrock pointed out the great amount of good that could be accomplished by a City Planning Commission.

It was moved by Sanders and seconded by Shrock that the following resolution be adopted.

WHEREAS, Henry W. Wiseman, the duly qualified and acting Treasurer of Milwaukie, is confined in a hospital and therefore is unable to perform the duties and transact the business of his office, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the duties of the office of Treasurer of Milwaukie be performed and the business thereof be transacted during the absence and inability of said Henry W. Wiseman to perform said duties and transact said business, and

WHEREAS, J. M. Mason appears to be a competent and qualified person to act as said Treasurer, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT, AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF MILWAUKIE:

A. That J.M. Mason be, and he is hereby appointed Deputy Treasurer of Milwaukie with power and authority to-

1. Collect moneys for Milwaukie and receipt for the same in the following manner:-

2. Issue and sign on behalf of Milwaukie checks and drafts upon the written direction of the Mayor of Milwaukie. Said checks or drafts to be signed in the following manner:-

"TOWN OF MILWAUKIE

Henry W. Wiseman, Treasurer
By J.M. Mason (signed) Deputy Treasurer."

B. That as a condition of his appointment and exercise of the powers herein conferred that said J.M. Mason be required to give an under-taking in the sum of One Hundred Dollars, conditioned upon his faithful performance of his duties and proper exercise of the authority herein conferred to him as said Deputy Treasurer.

C. That the appointment herein made and the power and authority herein granted be for the period of time August 13, 1934 to August 25, 1934, both dates inclusive.

D. That the compensation of said J.M. Mason as Deputy Treasurer be the sum of nothing Dollars per day on duty.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Sanders that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder Issue Warrants covering the same. Carried and so ordered.
