

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 14TH. 1923.

The two hundred fifty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 14th day of August, 1923. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Johnson, Kerr, McIntyre and Riley, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred fifty sixth regular meeting of the Council held on the 10th day of July, 1923, and the minutes of the adjourned meetings of the two hundred fifty sixth regular meeting held on the 17th day of July, 1923, and on the 25th day of July, 1923, were read and approved as read.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 198 entitled, "An ordinance adopting the survey, plat and report of the City Engineer on the proposed extension of 27th Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, McIntyre and Riley. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 198 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 198 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, McIntyre and Riley. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 198 passed the second reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 198 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, McIntyre and Riley. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 198 passed the third and final reading. The objections of S. J. Geston and Florence Backstrom to the acceptance of the improvement of Harrison Street were read and upon motion duly made and carried, the objections were over-ruled. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare and declare the assessment for the improvement of Harrison Street and post the same as required by the City Charter. Ordinance No. 199 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of the improvement bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and sections 3788 to 3796, both inclusive, of Oregon Laws, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council set the 31st day of August, 1923, at 8 o'clock P. M. of said day at the Council Chambers as the time and place for hearing and considering objections to the proposed assessment for the improvement of east Harrison Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the 31st day of August, 1923, at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M. of said day, and the Council Chambers was the time and place set for hearing objections to the acceptance of the improvement of 31st Street. Upon motion duly made Wm. Kleeb was appointed one of the appraisers to assess benefits and damages on the proposed extension of 27th Street.

A communication from Comte & Kohlman requesting the Council to furnish water to the Dairy tract of land was read and referred to the Water Committee. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in the amount of \$1925.35 on the 31st Street fund in favor of H. W. Oliver in payment of the balance due for the improvement of said Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Fire Chief was instructed to secure a helper and use the City fire hose and sprinkle 29th Street. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
