

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST, 19TH. 1913.

An adjourned meeting of the one hundred thirty-seventh (137) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Mayor Elmer being absent the meeting was called to order by councilman Mitchell. Present: councilmen Mitchell, King, Davis and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The following report of the Street Committee on the matter of the acceptance of the improvement of Foster Road was read, and upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the report was adopted as read:

Milwaukie, Oregon, August the 17th, 1913.

To the Common Council of the Town of Milwaukie.

Gentlemen:-

Your Street Committee has inspected the work on Foster Road and would report as follows: We find the pavement satisfactory and the work to all appearances done in conformity with the plans and specifications. A serious mistake, however, has been made at the curbs and crosswalk at the intersection of Irving Street, either upon the part of Engineer or contractor, and your committee would recommend that the work be not accepted until said mistake has been rectified.

The report of the committee appointed to assess benefits and damages on the proposed extension of Laurel Avenue was read and ordered filed, and upon motion duly made and carried, Tuesday the 9th day of September, 1913, at the hour of 8 P. M. was the time set for considering said report and hearing objections thereto.

A communication from O. Wissinger, manager of the Bonnett Estate, informing the Council of the appointment of Henry Smith, as one of the viewers to assess benefits and damages on the proposed widening of Harrison Street was read and ordered placed on file.

The following bills were allowed, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

- Pacific Coast Stamp Works, 30 firemen badges..... \$34.50
  - Kelly Hardware, Paint & Furniture Co, for material.. .75.
  - Adam Keck, for labor and material on bell tower.... 4.85.
- Ordinance No. 93 entitled " An ordinance granting to Crackamas County Gas Company, a corporation, its successors, and assigns, for a period of forty (40) years, the right, privilege and franchise to lay, maintain and operate gas mains, pipes and appertanances thereto, in the present and future streets, alleys and public highways of the Town of Milwaukie and its successors, for the purpose of supplying gas to the Town of Milwaukie and the inhabitants thereof and others, for light, heat, power and other purposes" was read and ordered posted.

Upon motion duly made and carried the Council adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.

A call meeting of the one hundred thirty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen Mitchell, King and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. A communication from the Rockolite Contracting Company in which they agreed to reconstruct the sidewalk and curbs at the intersection of Irving and Foster Road to the satisfaction of the Council and City Engineer, if the council would accept the improvement of said Foster Road and proceed to issue improvement bonds for the same, was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the proposition of the Rockolite Contracting Company was accepted and the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant against the Foster Road fund in payment of the balance due the company for the improvement of said Street upon the Company giving the Town a proper guarantee that they would complete the work according to their proposition.

Ordinance No. 89 was taken up for the first reading, the ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King and Counsell. Nays, none. Absent, Albee and Davis. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman King and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 89 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King and Counsell. Nays none. Absent Albee and Davis. Ordinance No. 89 passed the second reading.
