Streets, on the north side of Monroe Street between the sidewalk and property line. The plans, specifications and estimates for the construction of the sewers in Oak and 31st. Streets, filed with the Recorder by the City Engineer, were referred to the Sewer Committee for inspection.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUG. 23RD. 1927.

An adjourned meeting of the three hundred-fifth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 23rd. day of August, 1927. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Shrock and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The City Engineering having heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie plans and specifications for the construction of a sanitary sewer along 31st. Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council of Milwaukie, the following resolution was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was unanimously adopted as read:

2-1927 RESOLUTION FOR SEWER WORK.

Whereas, heretofore there has been filed with the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, a certain petition signed by the resident owners of more than one-fourth the area of the real property, in a certain district, as hereinafter described, within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, parying for the making of certain improvements by the laying of sewers, and,

Whereas, the Council of the Town of Milwaukie deems it expedient and necessary to grant said petition and make the improvement hereinafter described in the manner set forth, and has required from the City Engineer plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement and an estimate of the total cost of the work to be done, and

Whereas, the City Engineer has heretofore filed said plans and specifications and estimates in the office of the Recorder,

Now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the aforesaid plans, specifications and estimates of the city engineer now on file with the Recorder are found to be satisfactory, and are hereby approved; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council does declare its intention of making said improvement, the location and kind of said improvement being as follows:

By the construction of a certain sewer along the lines hereinafter stated, which said sewer shall include all catch basin inlets, and all other things necessary in the construction of said sewer, all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder, which said plans and specifications are hereby referred to and made a part of this resolution.

Said sewer is to be constructed along the following lines, and the termini and routes thereof are as follows:

Beginning at the present constructed manhole at the intersection of 31st and Elmer Streets; thence southerly along the easterly side of 31st. Street 1800 feet.

The City Engineer's estimate of the probable total cost of said improvement is Two Thousand nine hundred sixty-one Dollars and Fifty-one cents (\$2961.51).

The District liable to be assessed for the aforesaid improvement is as follows:

Beginning at a point in the north and south center line of Block 1 Quincy Addition to the Town of Milwaukie that is 100 feet distant southwesterly measured at right angles from the southwesterly property line of Elmer Street, Milwaukie, Oregon; thence south following the North and South center lines of Blocks 1, 9 and 10 to the Southwest corner of Lot 14, Blk 10 said Quincy Addition; thence East to the southeast corner of Lot 13, Blk 11 said Quincy Addition; thence north following the North and South center lines of Blocks 11, 8 and 2 of said Quincy Addition to a point in the north and south center lines of said Block 2 that is 100 feet southwesterly measured at right angles from the southwesterly property line of Elmer Street; thence northwesterly 100 feet southwesterly and parallel to the southwesterly property line of Elmer Street to the place of beginning.

That the above described district is the district referred to in Paragraph One (1) of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Marshal shall within five (5) days from the date hereon give notice of the passage of this resolution by posting three (3) notices headed "Notice of Sewer Work" on the street along the line of the contemplated sewer, which notice shall contain a copy of this resolution and shall set the time within which remonstrance against said improvement may be filed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that objections and remonstrances may be filed with the Recorder against the aforesaid improvement at any time within ten (10) days after the date of posting of said notices by the City Marshal, and the same will be heard and considered by the Council at a meeting of said Council to be held on the 13th. day of September, 1927 at 8 o'clock P. M.

The City Engineer having heretofore filed ^{with} the Recorder of Milwaukie, Oregon, plans and specifications for the construction of a sewer along Oak Street, in Milwaukie, Oregon, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was unanimously adopted as read:

The City Engineer's estimate of the probable total cost of said improvement is One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty-four and no/100 Dollars (\$1254.00).

The District liable to be assessed for the aforesaid improvement is as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of Lot 3, in Block 9 J. R. W. Sellwood's Addition to the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon; thence in a northeasterly direction 100 feet distant and parallel to the southeasterly line of Oak Street to the northeast corner of Lot 3, Blk 1, J. R. W. Sellwood's Addition to the Town of Milwaukie; thence in a northwest direction to the northeast corner of Lot 1, Block 2 Roberts Replat of J. R. W. Sellwood's Addition to the Town of Milwaukie; thence southwesterly through the center of Block 2 Roberts Replat of the J. R. W. Sellwood's Addition to the Town of Milwaukie to a point 100 feet northerly from the north property line of Elmer Street; thence southeasterly to the place of beginning.

That the above described district is the district referred to in Paragraph One (1) of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Marshal shall within five (5) days from the date hereon give notice of the passage of this resolution by posting three (3) notices headed "notice of Sewer Work" on the street along the line of the contemplated sewer, which notice shall contain a copy of this resolution and shall set the time within which remonstrance against said improvement may be filed.

TOWN HALL, SEPTEMBER 13TH. 1927.

The three hundred sixth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 13th. day of September, 1927. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Shrock and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 9th. day of August, 1927, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the three hundred fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 23rd. day of August, 1927, were read and approved as read. Councilman Sanders of the Street Committee reported that the Committee had met with the Union High School Directors in regard to the drainage on Willard Street and that the Union High School had agreed to pay one-half of the cost of putting in tiling for the proper drainage of said street.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee was instructed to put in tiling on Willard Street for the proper drainage thereof, with the understanding that the Union High School pay one-half of the cost thereof. The Street Committee reported that it had instructed Mr. Lowe to repair the steps and sidewalk in front of his property and to send the bill for the same to the Council. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Supt. was instructed to have the necessary gravel spread on Myrtle and Harrison Streets, and for shoulders on all paved streets.

The Water Supt. was instructed to construct a water pipe across the Monroe Street fill. The remonstrances against the construction of the sewer on 31st. Street were read, and it appearing that there were not sufficient property owners remonstrating to the defeat the sewer, upon motion duly made and carried, the remonstrances were over-ruled.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 276 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the amendments thereto, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-called showed the following result: Ayes,
