

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUG. 25TH. 1930.

An adjourned meeting of the three hundred forty-first regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 25th. day of August, 1930. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposals for straightening Harrison Street at 23rd. Street, were opened, which proposals were as follows:

The United Contracting Company having submitted the lowest and best bid, upon motion duly made and carried, the contract for the straightening of Harrison Street at 23rd. Street, was awarded to said Company for price of \$1663.80, and the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract on behalf of Milwaukie with the United Contracting Company for said improvement. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to return the certified checks to the unsuccessful bidders.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal and Street Supt. were instructed to close Jefferson Street at the foot thereof until the fall rain raises the water of the Willamette River sufficient to protect the outlet of the sewer, and to post notices prohibiting the dumping of piling and other logs into the river at the sewer outlet.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
