MEETING OF AUGUST 25, 1941.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS.

540th COUNCIL.

The five hundred fortieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-fifth day of August 1941.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Makin, Walden, Sperr; Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon, Officer Burbank, Attorney Adams, Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Kemmerer.

The minutes of the five hundred thirty-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the eleventh day of August 1941 were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Sperr that Mr. C.L. Sturtevant be granted a building permit. Motion carried and so ordered.

The members of the Council announced their selections for the Budget Committee as follows:

It was decided that the Budget meeting would be held at 7 P.M. on Monday September 15, 1941.

Mrs. Fusby requested that the Council reduce the price on the City owned property on Harrison street known as the Old Carver Right of Way, to the amount of the Lien without the interest. The Council felt that it would be unwise to set a price regardless of the amount of indebtedness on any City owned property.

Mr. W. Avison, of the Clackamas County Housing Authority, appeared before the Council and stated that the Authority had changed the streets within the United States Housing Project for Milwaukie to sixty feet in width and had arranged a street running north and south through the Project to join 31st street Milwaukie, and requested permission to attach to the sewer on Harrison street and that the Project be furnished their water supply by Milwaukie through a master meter.

The Mayor appointed Mrs. Newman, Mr. Bevington, and Mr. Makin as a committee to meet with the Authority and make arrangements for furnishing the Project with water, and Mr. Walden, Mr. Bevington and Mr. Sperr as a committee to consult the Oregon State Board of Health and City Engineer Ralph Milln regarding the adviseability of permitting the Project to attach to the Harrison street sewer.

A communication was read from Mr. John Borden, of Clackamas County Health Department, in which he brought the attention of the Council to the condition of the garbage dump on Balfour street. Mr. W. Avison stated that this was Government property and that in the near future signs would be posted prohibiting the dumping of garbage.

A communication from the Suburban Water Distributors Association, inviting Milwaukie to be represented at their meeting, was read. The Mayor appointed Mr. Bevington to attend the Meeting.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Makin that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Walden that the City purchase supplies for the Water department. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Sperr that Mr. Lewellyn be granted fifty dollars for expenses while attending the Oregon Fire Chief's Association at Bend Oregon September 15-16-17, also that he be given one week of his vacation following the convention. Motion carried and so ordered.

On motion duly made and seconded the meeting adjourned.
