Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Frady that the Manager's salary be \$330.00 per month and that the same be retroactive to August 1, 1947. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the night police officer's salary be \$225.00 per month and that the same be retroactive to August 1, 1947. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Hamlin that the Henderson Luelling Centennial Committee be permitted to have a street dance one evening during the centennial celebration in October, and that Main Street from Harrison to Scott Streets and Scott Street from Main to Front Streets be designated for this purpose. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the following resolution be adopted.

MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 8, 1947

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

684th MEETING

The six hundred eighty-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eighth day of September 1947.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Mortensen, Frady and Nelson; Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the six hundred eighty-third regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-fifth day of August 1947, were read and approved as read.

A petition, signed by owners of real property in Block 12 and 13 Quincy Addition, requesting that 33rd Street be improved between

Wister and Sellwood Streets, was read. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the matter be referred to the Manager and Attorney for their investigation and recommendation.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that Howard Nelson be permitted to move a chicken house on his property at 3425 King Street. Motion carried and so ordered.

A petition, protesting a rodent nuisance, and signed by occupants of an apartment house at 2325 Harrison St. was read. Manager Taber reported that the County Health Department had been notified and had taken over the responsibility of having the matter taken care of.

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Hamlin that hereafter the reading of the minutes, at the Council meeting, be dispensed with, that they be approved or corrected as written, and that they be referred to as unfinished business of the previous meeting. A called vote showed the following results: Ayes: Hamlin, Mortensen and Frady. Nays: Sperr and Nelson. Motion carried and was so ordered.

A letter from the Library Board, stating that they had selected Mrs. Anna Durning, of Oregon City, to succeed Mrs. Katherine Mason as Librarian, was read. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Nelson that the Council approve the action of the Library Board, with regard to employing a Librarian. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Taber read the recommendation of the Traffic Committee as follows:

Remove stop sign at 42nd & Harrison.  
 Make Monroe Street a stop street at R.R. Ave. and make R.R. Ave. a through street at this point.  
 (paint Stop sign on street at this point)  
 Make 28th a stop entering Monroe St.  
 No parking on the south side of Monroe Street from 21st St. east to 28th Street.  
 Make 40th a stop street entering King.  
 Make Harvey a Stop entering 32nd Street  
 Make Washington, Jefferson, Monroe, and Jackson Streets stop streets entering Main Street.  
 Make Main Street between Jefferson and Washington, two hour parking  
 Make 31st Street a stop street entering Elmer.  
 It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Mortensen that the recommendations of the Traffic Committee be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Taber presented an agreement between the City of Milwaukie and the Southern Pacific Co. entitling the City to put sewer pipe under the main line S.P. tracks at Harrison Street. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the Mayor sign the agreement providing that the said agreement meets with the approval of Attorney Kirkpatrick. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of installing a furnace in the City Hall was discussed. It was decided to talk with Auditor Phillips on the question before any steps be taken in the matter.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Attorney Kirkpatrick brought up the question of the cost of those residents inside the city but outside the sewer assessment district for attaching on to a sewer, also if or not those residents living on the immediate fringe of the corporate limits would be permitted to attach to the sewer and the cost therefore. After some discussion it was decided to meet at a later date when more data had been obtained, to settle the matter.

685th MEETING

The six hundred eighty-fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-second day of September 1947

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.
