





MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 8, 1958 926th meeting

The nine hundred twenty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, was held on the eighth day of September, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred twenty-fifth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eleventh day of August, 1958, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the twelfth day of August, 1958, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the eighteenth day of August, 1958, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-fifth day of August, 1958, were read and approved as read.

MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 8, 1958 continued

Ordinance Number 727, AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of sanitary sewers along certain streets in Ardenwald and 36th Street and for the construction of a trunk line sewer along Roswell Avenue, the easterly right-of-way line of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company, Stubb Street and Short Street, directing the City Manager to give notice inviting proposals therefor by publishing such notice in the Daily Journal of Commerce and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 727 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 728, AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 728 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 729 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Clay that Ordinance Number 729 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and was so ordered. Ordinance Number 729 AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure, without election, to annex certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 729 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A letter from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, in which they recommended that the Zone for Tax Lots 42,43,44,46,48,49,269 and 51-1 of Lot Whitcomb D.L.C. being properties along the south side of Harrison Street from 31st Street to 175 feet west of 34th Street, be changed from 3R-1 Zone to Commercial Zone, was read. Attorney Sheldahl was directed to draw the necessary ordinance for this change of Zone.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the improvement of 35th Street by curbs, sidewalks and driveways, and called for objection or remonstrances to the same. There was no citizen present who made objection, however there were two citizens present who requested that the assessment be more fully explained to them. The Mayor closed the hearing. Ordinance Number 730 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that Ordinance Number 730 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 730 AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the improvement of 35th Street, by curbs, sidewalks and driveways, along both sides thereof, where none existed, or where they did exist but did not conform to City Standards as to grade, alignment or quality, from its intersection with Washington Street to its intersection with Lake Road, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 730 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Manager Burdick reported that the Fontana dogs had been picked up by the Clackamas County Dog Control Department.

MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 8, 1958 cont. 926th meeting

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Roberts that the City subscribe to the National Institute of Municipal Law Officers and that the subscription cost of \$47.50 be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Burdick read a letter from Coquille Valley Lumber Co. in which they requested that they be permitted to empty their glue residue into the City sanitary sewer. It was decided that before such permission be granted that Manager Burdick make investigation and ascertain what an analysis of this residue will disclose, and report back to the Council.

A letter from Fire Chief Lillis, requesting the Council's approval of his attendance at a Fire Chief's Convention was read. The Council approved his absence from the City, and his expenses, to attend the Convention.

Manager Burdick presented an application, on behalf of Warren E. and Irene J. Hyde, for a Class "A" Dispensers License; and stated that Mr. Hyde was requesting that this application be held on file until such time that the Council was willing to increase the number of dispensers in Milwaukie. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Clay that the application be placed on file and held as the next applicant for "Dispensers License". Motion carried and so ordered.

The Police Chief's Report was read and ordered filed.

A letter, signed by twenty-five residents in the Island Station area, requesting that a stop and go signal light be installed on McLoughlin Blvd. at Second Street, was read. This matter was referred to the Traffic Committee.

Manager Burdick recommended that Mr. P. J. Beedle, who works in the Water Department be paid \$2.25 per hour. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Clay that Mr. Beedle be paid \$2.25 per hour. Motion carried and so ordered.

Attorney Sheldahl reported that the case of Kampf, Merriman, Kirkpatrick and Hager vs. the City of Milwaukie, had been settled out of court and that the City had agreed to not empty street storm drains into Spring Creek which flows through their properties.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Mortensen that the following bills be approved and that warrants be drawn for the payment of same.

SPECIAL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 30, 1958

A special meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, was held on the thirtieth day of September, 1958, for the purpose of accepting jurisdiction over Harrison Street from 42nd Street to 44th Street.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, and Roberts, Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin. Absent: Councilman Klein.

Attorney Sheldahl reported that the County had offered to surrender to the City, jurisdiction over Harrison Street between 42nd Street and 44th Street.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Mortensen that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 17-1958

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF THE COUNTY COURT OF CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON, TO SURRENDER JURISDICTION OVER HARRISON STREET, FROM 42nd STREET TO 44th STREET.

WHEREAS, it has been considered and deemed necessary and expedient and for the best interest of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, acquire and accept jurisdiction over certain portion of a county road lying within and adjacent to the corporate limits of said city, as the same is herewith described, and

WHEREAS, the County Court, pursuant to ORS 373.270 has
