MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 22, 1947

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

685th MEETING

The six hundred eighty-fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-second day of September 1947

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Nelson and Hamlin. Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin.

Manager Taber reported that if the cost of improvement of 33rd Street, between Wister and Sellwood Streets, could be taken care of by property owners along this block, it would save them both time and money, and advised that they make an effort to have the improvement done in this manner, and, if they so desired, that he would make a preliminary survey for the same.

A committee, from St. John Catholic Church, appeared before the Council, and made protest against the proposed parking restrictions on Monroe Street east of 21st Street. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the matter of parking restrictions on Monroe Street be referred back to the Mayor's Traffic Committee. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Taber read a letter from Federal Works Agency, also a resolution which they requested be adopted. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the following resolution be adopted, and that the Manager write a letter to Federal Works Agency explaining the procedure of raising money with which to repay out loan for advanced planning for sewer extensions. *RESOLUTION 6-1947*

WHEREAS the City of Milwaukie, herein called the "Applicant" has heretofore entered into an agreement with the United States of America, herein called the "Government", which provides that the Government will advance not to exceed \$4,355.00 to assist the Applicant in the planning of public works described as Sewer Extensions in the City of Milwaukie, and that the monies so advanced shall be returned to the Government when construction of the public works is first undertaken, and

WHEREAS the Applicant has received from the Government under such agreement \$2,177.50 and of such sum has expended \$2,177.50 for the planning of said public works, and

WHEREAS, the sum thus far advanced by the Government has achieved its purpose in expediting the plan preparation of the proposed public work and no additional advance is needed, and

WHEREAS, the applicant has awarded a contract for and has started the construction of Sewer extensions for which the aforementioned planning funds were advanced,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council, City of Milwaukie, that the proper administrative officials promptly take all necessary steps to return to the Government all the monies it advanced to assist in the planning of the said public work.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Government be, and it is hereby released from all obligations and all claims the Applicant may have against the Government in connection with said agreement, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in view of the foregoing, the Government be requested to release the Applicant from the terms of its agreement wherein the Applicant was to furnish a complete set of the completed plans and specifications and a standard of report thereon. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 500 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that Ordinance No. 500 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the Centennial Committee be given the use of the Council Chambers and Assembly room on October 16-17-18 and 19. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Sperr that the Auditor-Treasurer Report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the following bill be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue a warrant for the payment of same.

Richfield Oil Corp. gasoline. \$109.85
Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the minutes of the six hundred eighty-fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the eighth day of September 1947, be approved as written. Motion carried and so ordered.
