MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 22, 1952

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

805th MEETING

The eight hundred fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-second day of September 1952.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck; Attorney Kirkpatrick, Police Chief Delp and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred fourth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eighth day of September, 1952, were approved as written.

Nan Lafferty, John Ghelen, Ron Pattee and Dick Gorsek, acting as a committee from the Milwaukie Union High School, came before the Council and requested that they be permitted to hang a banner across Main Street, displaying the dates and other information of games in which the High school teams will be playing this school year. There was discussion regarding responsibility, height of banner, and security of anchorage of the banner. The Committee stated they would conform to all regulations in the matter. The Council agreed that the banner could be hung across the street and directed the acting Manager to work with the Committee in the matter.

Mr. George Schuber, 3535 S.E. Edison Street, again came before the Council with regard to a drainage problem which he stated was caused by the improvement of 35th St. It was agreed that the Council and acting Manager Sperr would meet Mr. Schuber on the property and try to work out a solution to the problem.

Fire Chief Lillis reported that he had talked with Mr. Nutting, owner of Top O' Scott golf club and recommended that the City ask a stand-by fee of \$50.00 per year and a per call charge of \$75.00 for fire protection of the property. It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Klein that the Attorney draw up a contract extending fire protection to Mr. Nutting's property at the Top O' Scott at \$50.00 annual stand-by charge and \$75.00 per call fee, also to include a clause terminating the contract if or when the City's contract with the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection is terminated. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 569 AN ORDINANCE prohibiting the possession of slot machines, pin ball games, dart games, roulette games, beano games, bingo games, punch boards, and all other similar devices in any place of business or entertainment in the City of Milwaukie: repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; providing a penalty; and referring this ordinance to the people of the City of Milwaukie; was taken up and read in full for its second reading. There was considerable discussion on the question of legality of this ordinance. Mr. Robert Mulvey, pointed out to the Council that the ordinance would, in part, be in conflict with the State laws, which licenses certain types of coin operated machines. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that Ordinance No. 569 be placed on its final passage. The motion was carried with the following results being had. Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 569 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Mr. W. O. Hampton, 546 37th St. came before the Council and requested that a street light be placed on 37th Street between King Road and Harvey Ave. No action was taken at this time.

Acting Manager Sperr reported that the sidewalks and curbs along Monroe & Campbell Streets, east of 29th Street will be finished on the morrow.

It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Mullan that street lights be placed on or near the following locations, 33rd and Madison Sts. 27th & Lake Road, 33rd St. south of Sellwood Street. Motion carried and so ordered.

A petition requesting a zone change for the E'ly $\frac{1}{2}$ of Block 1 and all of Block 2 Leo Addn, was laid before the Council. The petition was signed by owners of property as follows: Block 1, Lots 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10. Block 2, Lots 4-5-7-9-10. It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Taylor that the petition be referred to the Planning Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Mullan that the following bills be approved and that the same be ordered paid.

State Industrial Accident Commission for July \$95.52, for August \$89.83. Motion Carried and so ordered.

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD
ON THE 29th DAY OF SEPTEMBER 1952.

Acting manager Sperr announced that he had two bids for new police car: prices were net after trade in of Ford car; Davis for Chevrolet \$1074.95; Oregon City Motor Co. for Ford \$1026.90.

Moved by Taylor, seconded by Mullan that Acting Manager Sperr be authorized to complete the purchase of which ever car he deemed best for the City, if and when funds were available.

Moved by Norbeck, seconded by Taylor that Councilman Mullan be elected by the Council to fill the unexpired term of Mayor Sperr. Roll call vote showed the following results: Yeas: Sperr, Taylor, Norbeck; Nays: Klein; Not voting: Mullan.

Moved by Taylor seconded by Norbeck that Fred Sperr be appointed as City Manager at a Salary of \$250.00 per month. Roll call showed: Yeas: Taylor, Mullan and Norbeck; Nays: Klein; not voting: Sperr.
