

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 18TH 1914.

An adjourned meeting of the one hundred forty-ninth regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Loeding, Mitchell, Counsell, King and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. Upon motion duly made and carried, the bid of W. H. Counsell for the improvement of Laurel Avenue was read and referred to the Street Committee. The Street Committee reported that as W. H. Counsell's bid was the only bid received for the improvement of Laurel Avenue, it would recommend that the contract for the improvement of Laurel Avenue be awarded to W. H. Counsell for \$4034.04. Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the Street Committee was adopted. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to enter into a contract, in behalf of the Town, with W. H. Counsell for the improvement of Laurel Avenue, said contract to contain the same provisions as the one entered into with Mr. Patton. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 108 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Counsell, Loeding and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 108 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 108 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 108 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 108 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 108 passed the third and final reading. Moved by councilman Mitchell and seconded by councilman Loeding, that the Mayor be instructed before signing the Campbell franchise ordinance, that he enter into a stipulation with the said Campbell that he, the said Campbell, will in no way interfere with or obstruct the building of any line of any party granted a franchise for a railway line in the future by the Council. Motion carried. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, SEPTEMBER, 8TH. 1914.

The regular one hundred fiftieth (150) meeting of the Town Council of the town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the one-hundred forty-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the 11th day of August, 1914, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting held on the 18th day of August, 1914, were read and approved as read.

The following bills were read and approved by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

A communication from the S. P. Co. in regard to the over head crossing on Front Street was read and ordered placed on file.

A petition of the property owners on Irving Street asking the council to install an arc light on said street was read and referred to the Light Committee. A petition of the property owners on Irving Street asking for the survey of said street and the establishment of the grades on said street was read and referred to the street committee. A communication from C. M. Patton for an extension of two weeks time in which to complete Monroe Street was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, Mr Patton was granted two weeks further time in which to complete the improvement of Monroe Street.

The objection of the Bonnett heirs to the acceptance of the Harrison Street improvement was read and referred to the Street Committee. Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter of the acceptance of the improvement of Harrison Street was postponed until the same could be investigated by the Street Committee.

Ordinance No. 116 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds in pursuance of sections 3245, 3246, 3247, 3248, 3249, 3250, 3251, 3252 and 3253 Lord's Oregon Laws, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter.

Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Albee and carried, Mr. Thomas was authorized to raise the water of Kellogg Lake to the height it was before the improvement of Front Street, and the Marshal was instructed to arrest any one removing the Dam from the outlet of said Lake.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned subject to the call of the mayor.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the S. P. Co. to repair its railroad crossing in Milwaukie by planking the same. A petition for the installation of an arc light on Milwaukie and Sandy Road was read and referred to Street Committee.

A petition to change the name of Front Street to Milwaukie Highway was read and referred to Street Committee. A petition to establish the grades of the Streets in Sellwood Addition was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the petition was allowed and the engineer instructed to establish the grades as petitioned for.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, L. H. Campbell was granted until April 1st, 1915, to begin the construction of a railroad in Milwaukie.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 116 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 116 passed the first reading.

Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 116 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 116 passed the second reading.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 116 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 116 passed the third and final reading. Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the Front and Dewitt Streets improvement bonds, said bids to be opened on the 20th day of October, 1914.

The matter of allowing the High School student to play basket ball in the City Hall was referred to the Fire Commission for recommendation.
