

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the acceptance of said offer be communicated to said County of Clackamas and to the County Court thereof in compliance with the provisions of said order by filing in the office of the County Clerk of said County a certified copy of this resolution.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to survey that portion of a county road between Front Street and the Willamette River taken over by the Town and place iron pipes at each corner and to set grade stakes for the construction of cement sidewalks in front of the property of the Episcopal Church. The report of the State Health Board on the analysis of the water from the City wells showed the water unfit for domestic use.

The Report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. The application of C. C. Mullan for an increase of salary from \$25.00 per month to \$75.00 per month was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the salary of C. C. Mullan was raised from \$25.00 per month to \$75.00 per month. Upon motion duly made and carried, H. W. Cliver was granted fifteen days addition time within which to complete the improvement of Harvey Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the Harvey Street fund in the amount of \$1000.00 in favor of Mr. Cliver in part payment of the improvement of Harvey Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 214 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, Kleeb and McIntyre. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 214 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 214 was laid on the table until the next regular meeting.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, SEPT 9TH. 1924.

The two hundred seventieth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 9th. day of September, 1924. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred sixty-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the 12th day of August, 1924, was read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Riley was instructed to purchase sufficient hot stuff and patch all the paved streets in Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 214 was taken up for the second reading. The ordinance being read, councilman Miller objected to the passage of the ordinance in its present form.

Moved by councilmen Miller and seconded by councilman McIntyre that ordinance No. 214 be amended that the Southern Pacific Company in replacing the fill across Kellogg Lake will replace the same with a steel structure or other modern structure satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie. Motion carried. The Recorder was instructed to redraft ordinance No. 214 as amended and post the same as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Riley was instructed to notify the property owners to clean the sidewalks in front of their property as required by City ordinances. TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, GREGON, OCTOBER 14TH. 1924.

The two hundred seventy-first regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 14th. day of October, 1924. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder *Mathews* and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred seventieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 9th. day of September, 1924, were read and approved as read. A delegation of the Parent-Teachers' Association was present and called the attention of the Council to the bad condition of the sidewalk between Island Station and Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Street Supt. were instructed to have the sidewalk repaired. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 214 was taken up for the second reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 214 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, further action on the passage of ordinance No. 214 was indefinitely postponed. A petition requesting the Council to install an arc lamp at the upper end of 23rd. Street in Streib's Addition was read and upon motion duly made and carried, an arc lamp was ordered installed where requested. The application of J. A. Keck for an increase in salary was read and taken under advisement. Upon motion duly made and carried, the following persons were appointed as the budget committee: M. J. Walsh, Thaddeus Stafford, Thomas Walker, G. C. Felton and W. H. Grasle. Mr. Snyder was present and requested the Council to have the grades established on Lewellyn Street between 40th & 42nd Streets and on 40th. Street from King Street to Harrison Street. J. M. Snyder was granted permission to use blasting powder to blow out some stumps in Lewellyn Street upon the condition that he save the Town harmless from any damage that may result. The Marshal was instructed to charge the lodges the sum of \$4.00 per night for the use of the City Hall.
