It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Rowe that the City purchase two series "F" Defense Bonds at \$740.00 each, from the water fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 449 AN ORDINANCE providing for the vacation of a portion of Twenty-ninth street, which lies in Sellwood's Addition to Quincy Addition, Milwaukie, was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance number 449 was read the second and third times by title only with the consent of the Council and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Newman, Bevington, McClure and Rowe. Nays: None. Ordinance number 449 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same

MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 11, 1944

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

612nd MEETING

The six hundred twelfth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of September 1944.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Bevington, McClure and Rowe; Treasurer Walcott; Fire Chief Lewellyn, Officer Butler and Recorder Martin. Absent; Councilman Sperr and Water Superintendent Counsell.

The minutes of the six hundred eleventh regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-eighth day of August 1944, were read and approved.

A petition, signed by nine members of the Fire Department, ^{vacation} requesting that the action taken by the Council at the meeting of August 28, 1944 with regard to vacations of employees, be not applied in the case of Fire Chief Lewellyn, was read. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that an exception to the employees vacation policy be made and that Fire Chief Lewellyn be given two weeks vacation with pay for 1944. The vote was as follows: Ayes: two. Nays: two. The mayor then voted favorable. The motion carried and was so ordered.

Engineer Milln made a report of the depth and capacity of the sewers at 29th and Monroe streets. It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Rowe that the engineer be instructed to make a survey and prepare plans, specifications, and costs for a sewer on Monroe street between 29th street and Campbell street. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of paying the cost of an assistant for the Librarian was discussed by the Council and members of the Library Board present. It was decided that the Library should bill the City each month for \$10.00, the bill to be paid from the Social Welfare fund, and that the City would pay the salary for the assistant during the Librarian's vacation.

Mr. Harry Dean came before the Council and stated that he wished to make protest, on behalf of four Milwaukie organizations,

as to the condition of the shrubs at the DeSmet Park and the City Hall. He stated that some of the shrubery at the Park was dead and that all shrubs in both places were in sad need of water. Mrs. Newman stated that Mr. Young of the State Highway Department had called her attention to the condition of the shrubery at the DeSmet Park and had told her that Milwaukie had made an agreement with the Highway Department to keep the park cared for. After some discussion Mr. Lewellyn and Mr. Stevens asked to be excused from further responsibility of the Park and City Hall grounds but offered to water the City Hall lawn until a regular gardner could be employed. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that the matter of securing a caretaker for the DeSmet Park and City Hall grounds be turned over to Mrs. Newman and that she be authorized to contract for the same for a sum not to exceed \$900.00 per year. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 450, AN ORDINANCE providing that each person, firm or corporation seeking water service must provide a shut-off between the meter and the premises served, was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance Number 450 was read the second and third times by title only with the consent of the Council and put on its passage with the following results being had, Ayes: Newman, Bevington, and McClure. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 450 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 451, AN ORDINANCE providing for the regulation of the outside use and consumption of water, was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance Number 451 was read the second and third times by title only with the consent of the Council and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Newman, Bevington and McClure. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 451 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that the Auditor--Treasurer report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mrs. Newman was requested to look into the matter of locating a car suitable for use as a Police car for Milwaukie.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Newman that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
