It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Graf, that the minutes of the regular meeting of August 28, 1967, be approved as written. Motion carried and so ordered.

CORRESPONDENCE

Letter from City of Oregon City, dated, September 7, 1967, extending the City's appreciation for the assistance given by Milwaukie Fire Department on September 1, on the fire in downtown Oregon City, was read and ordered filed.

ORDINANCE NO. 1165

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Clore, that Ord. No. 1165, be taken up for its first reading. (Improvement of Wake Street from 32nd.) Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Clore, seconded by Graf, that Ord. No. 1165, be moved to second reading by title only and adopted at the next meeting of the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

ASSESSMENT HEARING - 38th Street Extension

City Engineer Daigle quoted figures for the street improvement on 38th Street, giving the cost based on front footage as well as curb frontage. It was his recommendation that the assessment be made on the front footage basis.

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Clore, that the Council accept the recommendation of the City Engineer and declare the assessment on the front footage figures submitted. Council determination to be made at the next meeting of the Council to allow time for all property owners to be notified of the assessment costs. Motion carried and so ordered.

HEARING ON CHALET L'ABBE

Hearing was opened on the request for approval of a Class "B" Dispenser's License submitted by the Chalet L'Abbe at the Council meeting on June 12, 1967. Action was deferred at that time until September 11, 1967.

Ralf Erlandson, 1108 Main Street, Attorney for Mrs. Aebi, submitted to the Council petitions with approximately 500 signatures from patrons of the Chalet expressing their approval for the serving of liquor at the restaurant.

Mr. Gerald Meindl, Attorney, 2545 Terwillinger Blvd., addressed the Council and explained the Class B liquor license, and the restrictions that would go with it.

Councilman Graf asked that a report be made to the Council on the action taken to date with regard to the City's attempt to purchase the So. Pacific property at Oak and Monroe Street. To be on the September 25th agenda.

PAYMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION WORK

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Graf, that payment for the work done to date on Monroe Street Water Main and Valve Vault, in the amount of \$5,324.49, be made to Don Thornton. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Graf, seconded by Clore, that payment in the amount of \$322.55, 10% retainer fee, be paid upon completion of the required waiting period, for the work on the water main extension at 37th Street. Portland Rd. and Driveway - Contractors. Motion carried and so ordered.

PAYMENT OF BILLS

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Clore, that the bills listed for Sept. 12, 1967 payment be approved and warrants drawn for payment of same. Motion carried and so ordered.

On motion duly made and seconded, the meeting adjourned at 9:50 p. m.
