Mr. Hart made a report on the petition for opening a street from the Catholic Church to Washington Street, and upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare a petition for a 50 foot Street from Monroe Street through to Lake Road. Mr. Counsell made a report on the petition for extending 31st St. to Lake Road, and upon motion duly made and carried, the petition was referred back to Mr. Counsell for another report. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

Town Hall, Milwaukie, Oregon, Sept. 12th. 1922.

The two hundred forty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 12th day of September, 1922. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Miller, Shindler and Hart, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 182, "entitled An Ordinance granting to Southern Pacific Company, its successors, lessees and assigns the perpetual privilege and franchise to construct, lay down, maintain and operate an industry spur track upon and across Irving Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Miller and Hart. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 182 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 182 was taken up for the second reading and ordinance No. 182 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Miller and Hart. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 182 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 182 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 183 passed. A petition of property owners whose property abut on Myrtle Street for the improvement of Myrtle Street was read and ordered placed on file. The Council deeming it necessary and to improve said street as petitioned for, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Myrtle Streets as petitioned for and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. Whereupon the City Engineer filed plans and specifications for the improvement of Myrtle Street in accordance with the petition therefor, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. And said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council the following resolution was read and adopted upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read:

Resolution and Notice for the improvement of Myrtle Street from the West Line of Campbell Street to a point 18' East of the center line of Elmer Street.

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the office of the Recorder of said Town plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Myrtle Street, according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and whereas, said plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby approved and adopted: AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie, by its Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

- (1) That said street be improved from the west line of Campbell Street, thence westerly to a point 18' east of the center line of Elmer Street.
- (2) The street shall be brought to a grade as established by the City Engineer. 8" of pit run gravel 8' in width to be spread along the center of the aforesaid street; provision to be made to borrow any necessary fill material to bring said Myrtle Street to the required grade.
- (3) Concrete sidewalks 4' in width shall be put in on both sides of the street except that wooden sidewalks may be substituted over filled ground if found to be necessary by the City Engineer. Concrete sidewalks to be 4" thick and all sidewalks to be 18" from the property line. All necessary sidewalks to be put in at the Elmer Street intersection.
- (4) Gutters lines to be 15' from the center of said Myrtle Street
- (5) Provision to be made for draining water from said Myrtle Street as the City Engineer shall deem necessary.
- (6) A cross walk of wood or cement on the east side of Elmer Street to be provided for, if found to be necessary. All work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie, Oregon. Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of said Town on or before ten (10) days from the 16th day of September, 1922.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this Resolution and Notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 184 entitled "An ordinance establishing the grades on Myrtle Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the east line of Elmer Street to the west line of Campbell Street," was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter. A petition of School District No. 1, owner of property abutting of 27th Street, for the extension of said Street from the north line of the Olsen property southerly to Lake Road, was read, and the Council deeming it expedient to grant such petition, the following resolution was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read:

RESOLUTION:

Whereas, School District No. 1, owner of real property abutting on 27th Street, has presented a petition, properly signed, to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie for the extension of 27th Street from the north line of the Olsen property southerly to Lake Road, said extension to be the same width of the present 27th Street; And, whereas the Council deems it expedient and necessary that said extension be made as petitioned for: THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, that the City Engineer proceed, and he hereby is instructed to make a survey of the proposed extension of 27th Street, and to make a plat of the same, and a written report containing a full and complete description of said extension and of the boundaries thereof, and of the portions of each lot and tract of land to be appropriated therefor, and file the same with the Recorder of Milwaukie, Oregon. Upon motion duly made and carried, Councilman Miller was instructed to execute a quitclaim deed of lots 35, 36 and 41 in Block 43, Minthorn Addition to Christina Petersen, upon payment of the City taxes against said property, together with costs and penalty. Also to execute a quitclaim deed of lots 5 & 6, in Block 28, Kerr & Shindler Addition and place the same in escrow in the First State Bank of Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, the First State Bank was authorized to bid in all the property sold for delinquent assessments and hold the same in trust for the Town of Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to have Mr. Counsall repair the sidewalks on East Monroe Street. The recorder was instructed to notify The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to remove the pole and anchor arm from in front of Henry Streib's house. TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, OCTOBER 3rd 1928.

The two hundred forty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 3rd day of October, 1928. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib, and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred forty-fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 1st day of August, 1928, and of the adjourned meeting of the two hundred forty fifth regular meeting held on the 8th day of August, 1928, and of the special meeting of the Council held on the 15th day of August, 1928, and also the minutes of the two hundred forty-sixth regular meeting of the Council held on the 13th day of September, 1928, were read and approved as read. A communication from the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. in regard to removing the pole and anchor arm from in front of Henry Streib's property was read and placed on file. The Treasurer's Report was read and upon motion duly made and carried was ordered placed on file. The following persons were appointed as the Budget Committee for Milwaukie: Casper Kerr, Thaddeus Stafford, W. S. Perry, H. W. Hopkins, and Wm. Shindler. A communication from B. L. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 184 was taken up for the first reading, the ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Nays, none. Ordinance No. 184 passed at the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 184 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Nays, none. Ordinance No. 184 passed at the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 184 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Nays, none. Ordinance No. 184 passed at the third and final reading. Ordinance No. 185 entitled: An ordinance providing for the improvement of Myrtle Street, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the west line of Campbell Street, thence westerly to a point 18 feet east of the center line of Elmer Street, and declaring an emergency, was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter. The City Engineer reported that he had talked with Mrs. Ois in regard to extending 27th Street through her property and she advised him that she would let him know in a short time whether or not she would allow the street to be extended through her property without condemnation proceedings. The City Engineer also reported that he had made a survey of a street from the Catholic Church through to Lake Road.
