

COUNCIL CHAMBERS SEPTEMBER 12, 1938

The four hundred seventy-third regular meeting of the Council was held on the 12th day of September, 1938.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Burdick. Present: Mayor Burdick, Councilmen Dell, Kirkpatrick, Ledding, Mourer and Roberts. Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Stanley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred seventy-first and four hundred seventy-second regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 8th and 22nd days of August, 1938 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Ernest Davis and F. J. Dana, of Rex Appleby Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars requested the Councils assistance in establishing a school and court for bicycle riders. They were asked to supply further details at the next council meeting.

It was moved by Ledding and seconded by Mourer that the rear door to the City Hall be moved out flush with the building. Motion carried and so ordered.

L. D. Shove requested that the Boy Scouts be allowed to establish quarters in the City Hall. Mayor Burdick referred Mr. Shove to the School Board, District No. 1.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS SEPTEMBER 16, 1938

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 16th day of September, 1938 pursuant to the call of Mayor Burdick for the purpose of considering the 1939 City Budget as submitted by the Budget Committee and for determining the tax levy for City purposes for the year 1939.

Present: Mayor Burdick, Councilmen Dell, Kirkpatrick, Ledding, Mourer and Roberts; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Stanley, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Recorder Adams and Budget Committee Members H. G. Coates, S. L. Burton and Clarence W. Rudder.

Ordinance Number 384 entitled "An Ordinance providing a tax levy on all taxable property within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon for City purposes for the year One Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty-nine (1939)." was taken up for consideration.

The Mayor asked if there was any one present who desired to be heard on the matter of the City 1939 Budget. There was no response.

Ordinance Number 384 was read for the first, second and third times and put on its passage with the following results being had.

Ayes: Dell, Kirkpatrick, Ledding, Mourer and Roberts.

Nays: None.

Ordinance Number 384 passed the Council.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS SEPTEMBER 26, 1938

It was moved by Ledding and seconded by Roberts that the City purchase six oil-burning circulator heaters. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Ledding and seconded by Kirkpatrick that the City trade the old Recorder's safe to School District No. 1 for a sink. Motion carried and so ordered.
