MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 13, 1943.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

588th MEETING

The five hundred eighty-eighth regular meeting of the Council was held on the thirteenth day of September 1943.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Newman, Bevington and Sperr, Attorney Adams, Treasurer Farrington, Fire Chief Fenton, Officer Rigdon, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilmen McClure and Rowe and Water Superintendent Counsell.

The minutes of the five hundred eighty-seventh regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-fourth day of August 1943 were read and approved as read.

Mr. Sperr reported that most of the patching work on the streets had been done and the remaining street work would be taken care of soon, he also reported that as yet he had been unable to get a man to paint the street markings. It was agreed that "CAUTION SCHOOL" signs be painted on 27th street at points north and south of the grammar school.

Mrs. F. Piper came before the Council and stated that, on account of improper drainage, the water stayed in the street at 29th and Washington Streets. Mr. Sperr stated that this corner was on the list for repair work and that it would be cared for soon.

Mr. C V Crispin appeared before the Council and explained that due to the fact that the room he had intended to use as a card room was being used as a store room, he had not been able to start his card games and requested that he be granted a three month extension of time on his card room license. It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that Mr. Crispin's request be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

A committee from the Ardenwald Community Club appeared before the Council with regard to fire protection for that community. The Mayor advised that they organize a fire district and assured them that Milwaukie would cooperate with them in every way possible.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that City Engineer Milln be authorized to approve the Plat of Wilson Addition. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Bevington that Engineer Milln be authorized to establish the grade of Washington street between Main street and McLoughlin Blvd. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Sperr that the letters "CITY HALL" above the entrance of the City Hall, be painted with gold leaf at a cost not to exceed \$10.00. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Auditor and Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Newman that Officer Shockley's salary be \$175.00 per month beginning September 1. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Bevington that the Fire Department be granted permission to build eight lockers in their quarters. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Newman that Water Superintendent Counsell's salary be \$250.00 per month beginning September 1. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Newman that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 27, 1943.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS.

589th MEETING

The five hundred eighty-ninth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-seventh day of September 1943.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present. Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Newman, Bevington, Sperr, Mc Clure and Rowe, Treasurer Farrington, Marshal Rigdon, Engineer Milln, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Water Superintendent Counsell.

The minutes of the five hundred eighty-eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the thirteenth day of September 1943, were read and approved as read.

Mr. Sperr reported that the street work had been finished with what materials had been available, he also stated that 31st street from Harrison street to Meek street had been scraped and treated with R C 4

Mr. Milln recommended that the grade on the west end of Washington street be established as a straight grade from Main street to McLoughlin Blvd. and stated that this would be about a 5% grade. Mr. J. Earl Jones, owner of a building at Main and Washington Streets, pointed out that a straight 5% grade would leave the Washington St.
