A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Albee, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Council. The Mayor stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering the bids for painting the City Hall. The following persons submitted bids, to-wit:

Upon motion duly made and carried, the bid of Fred Pieper of \$117.00, being the lowest bid for painting the City Hall, was accepted and the contract awarded to Mr. Pieper. An adjourned meeting of the two hundred thirty regular meeting of the Council was held on the 28th day of September, 1921. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Albee, Shindler, Miller and Hart. Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Keck. Upon Motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 175 entitled "An ordinance adopting the survey, plat and report of the City Engineer on the proposed widening and extension of Harrison Street, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and declaring an emergency" was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Albee, Shindler, Miller and Hart. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 175 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 175 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Albee, Shindler, Miller and Hart. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 175 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 175 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Albee, Shindler, Miller and Hart. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 175 passed. Upon motion duly made and carried, Earl C. Burdick as the Town representative to view the proposed widening and extension of Harrison Street and with the other viewers to make an assessment of the benefits and damages. The Recorder was instructed to notify the other property owners whose property is to be appropriated for the widening and extension of Harrison Street to appoint a viewer as required by the City Charter.

A communication from the Oregon Insurance Rating Bureau in regard to fire insurance rates in Milwaukie was read and referred to the Fire Chief. A resolution of 125 citizens of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, requesting the Council to pass ordinances prohibiting the showing of any motion pictures not censored by a competent board of censors duly appointed by the citizens of Milwaukie, and prohibiting any public dances on Sunday except those given in connection with picnics given by well known and respectable societies or for worthy purposes, was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the matter was postponed for consideration later. A petition of some of the property owners along Harvey Street for the improvement thereof was read, and the Council deeming it necessary that said Street be improved in accordance with the petition therefor, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement as petitioned for, estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. Mr.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Thaddeus Stafford was appointed one of the Budget Committee to prepare estimates of the expenditures for the coming year for Milwaukie, to take the place of M. J. Walsh, resigned. A communication from the S. P. Co. stating that it would donate the sum of \$275.00 toward the repair of Eddy Street was read and ordered placed on file. Mr. Albee advised the Council that he had collected \$110.00 toward the repair of said Street. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and warrants ordered drawn in payment of same:

Mr. Pelton and Mr. McIntyre two of the committee appointed by the Citizens of Milwaukie at a Mass meeting held on Sept. 20, 1921, were present and stated that knowledge had come to the people of Milwaukie through paper reports that the old prize fight Arena was to be transformed into a dance hall and moving picture house where uncensored pictures were to be shown and Sunday dances to be carried on, and that they had been instructed to request the Council to take in action to prevent the showing of uncensored pictures and Sunday dancing. The Council took no action in the matter, Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
