It was moved by Clay and seconded by Shook that the Recorder be authorized to accept promisory note in payment for assessment of the 30th Street improvement by curbs and sidewalks, the note to provide a minimum payment of \$100.00 plus interest on the unpaid balance and the maximum time, which to pay in full, of two years, Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Leo Butler came before the Council and resigned his position as Municipal Judge, stating that the County Court had requested him to either resign as County Constable or resign and City Municipal Judge. Mayor Mullan volunteered to contact County Judge Telford and ascertain if he (Telford) would object to Mr. Butler continuing to serve as Municipal Judge, until his successor was appointed.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that the following bills be approved and that warrants be drawn for the payment of same.

MEETING OF OCTOBER 10, 1955

The eight hundred seventy-eighth regular meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie was held on the 10th day of October, 1955 in the Council chambers at the City Hall.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Leonard Mullan.

Present; Mayor Leonard Mullan, Councilmen, Ralph Klein, Raphael Shook, City Attorney John Sheldahl, City Manager Earl S. Burdick, City treasurer, Jean Dillery.

The minutes of the 877th regular meeting of the City Council held on the 26th day of September were approved and corrected.

Due to the absence of Earl Clay, councilman, the application for recommendation of 1955 class "A" dispensers license (liquor by the drink) to be used at Mac's Pit Super Highway and Washington St. was delayed until his recommendation was presented.

Attorney Algen Moore and G. Lee Wright appeared before the council and requested an extension of time on the agreement with Ardenwald Sanitary District and the city of Milwaukie, Oregon of a period of two years, which was to expire December 15, 1956.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that the City of Milwaukie grant the Ardenwald Sanitary District a two year extension of time on their agreement with the city of Milwaukie from December 14, 1956 to December 14, 1958.

Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. John Botsford and Mr. George Mickel property owners along 34th St south of Washington came before the council on the matter of approval of the 34th St. improvement.

They were assured the contractor (Cushing Brothers) and their bonding company would be notified by letter from the city manager, that the city of Milwaukie was holding the contractor and the bonding company liable for the work performed by Cushing Brothers and that they remove and replace curbs and sidewalks as requested by the city manager.

Mr. Harley Roberts, 2600 Lake Road, appeared before the council on the matter of the blocking of Lakeside Drive by Mr. H. M. Meyers. The manager stated that this was a dedicated St. and could not be blocked and that the manager would order Mr. Meyers to remove the same.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that the treasurer be authorized to issue a warrant to Wm. R. Davis for the purchase of rite of way at the North end of Main St. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that the Chief of Police report be accepted as presented and filed. Motion carried and so ordered.
