MEETING OF OCTOBER 27, 1947

687th MEETING

The six hundred eighty-seventh regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-seventh day of October 1947

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Hamlin, Mortensen, Frady and Nelson. Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin.

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Hamlin that the minutes of the six hundred eighty-sixth regular meeting of the Council, held on the thirtieth day of October 1947, be approved as corrected. Motion carried and so ordered.

Chairman of the traffic Committee, Nelson, reported that the committee would be prepared to give their recommendations on the stop sign at Railroad Ave. and Oak Street, and the parking problem along Monroe Street west of 28th Street, at the next regular meeting of the Council.

Mr. H. B. Woods, Oak Grove, made application for recommendation for retail Beer Class B. license, to be used at Milwaukie Cafe, 1212 Main Street. It was decided that Manager Taber and acting Fire Chief Stavens should inspect the property and that Police Chief Delp should make investigation of Mr. Woods, and report their findings and make their recommendations at the next regular meeting of the Council

Mr. Otto Rickman, 9550 32nd St. appeared before the Council and requested that the 32nd Street Sewer, north of Harvey Ave. be shortened by 50 feet, stating that he was the owner of all the assessable property north of Harvey. Attorney Kirkpatrick explained to Mr. Rickman why the assessment district could not be changed at this time. Mr. Rickman withdrew his request.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Nelson that, in order that a record may be made of the property in Milwaukie now connected to sewers, Manager Taber be authorized and directed to have a survey made of all property along the present installed sewer lines. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that, in order that the City shall have a record of all property henceforth connected to sewers, Attorney Kirkpatrick be instructed to prepare an ordinance providing that hereafter, before connecting to any sewer in Milwaukie it shall be required that a permit be granted so to do. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Nelson that Attorney Kirkpatrick prepare a condemnation resolution against that tract of land described in deed recorded in Vol. 197, Page 420, Record of Deeds for Clackamas County, Oregon, or as much thereof as may be required for the improvement of 21st Street, this property being otherwise known as the Arthur Kelly property. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Mortensen that Attorney Kirkpatrick proceed with a condemnation resolution covering the site of the proposed sewer disposal plant, together with all necessary rights of ways and easements for sewers. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that Manager Taber advertise for bids for razing the old City Hall. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Mortensen that, due to his years of service and of long hours served, Fire Chief Don Lewellyn be given sick leave pay until December 1, 1947 and that an additional hoseman be employed. Motion carried and so ordered.

There was discussion regarding the feasibility of employing a third police officer. It was decided that Manager Taber employ an officer to work during Chief Delp's absence on vacation and that he confer with Auditor Phillips on the matter of funds with which to pay a third officer.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the City pay the radio technician on a month to month basis of \$6.50 per mobile unit for the City cars equipped with radio. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Taber reported the installation of a police call telephone in the City office with extension in the Fire Department.

Ordinance Number 501 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Frady that Ordinance Number 501 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the Auditor-Treasurer report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that Manager Taber be instructed to employ a catpillar operator to rough in the grade and to gravel 21st Street between Jackson and Harrison Streets, also that Manager Taber arrange for the removal of the baseball backstop now on the Junior High School grounds within the boundary of said proposed street. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the rent for the City Hall basement only, be \$3.00 per night. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mortensen that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same
