

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, OCTOBER 4TH. 1921.

The two hundred thirty-fifth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 4th day of October, 1921.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Shindler, Albee, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred thirty-fourth regular meeting held on the 6th day of September, 1921, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 16th day of September, 1921, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the two hundred thirty fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the 28th day of September, 1921, were read and approved as read. Mr. Counsell of the Street Committee reported that he had started to put gravel on Railroad Avenue and had put in culverts and cross-walks on some of the streets and would gravel the streets later. The matter of permitting the Portland Open Air Sanatorium to connect a six inch water main to the City Water Main was referred to the Water Committee. The report of the Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. A petition of some of the business men of Milwaukie requesting the Council to appoint J. A. Keck Nightwatchman and contribute toward the payment of his salary was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Council appointed J. A. Keck Night Watchman and donated \$25.00 per month toward the payment of his salary. The City Engineer having filed plans and specifications, and estimates of the work to be done and probable cost thereof of the improvement of ~~xxxxx~~ Harvey Street with the Recorder of Milwaukie, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council, upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was read and adopted as read: RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF HARVEY STREET IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

Res 1 - 1921

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed in the office of the Recorder of said Town plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Harvey Street according to the petition therefor heretofore filed with the Recorder, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and, whereas, said plans and specifications and ~~estimates~~ estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie; THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby approved: AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and the intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Council to make said improvement, being described as follows:

(1). That said street be improved from a point beginning on the east side of the County Road #162 and about 593 feet ~~southerly~~ southerly from the northwest corner of the Hector Campbell D. L. C. Cl. #69, thence easterly to the City limits of said Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

(2). The road shall be graded to a width of 40 feet and gutters to be 12 feet from the center line.

(3). Five feet on each side of the center line of said street shall be sub-graded to allow for eight inches of gravel. Gravel to be spread in two courses, the bottom course to be medium fine pit run gravel. The bottom course shall be rolled if found to be feasible. Thickness of courses, size of gravel and rolling to be at the direction of the City Engineer.

(4). Culvert shall be installed. Size and kind and plans for same, at the discretion of the City Engineer. All of said work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution.

Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of said Town on or before ten days from the 6th day of October, 1921.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this Resolution and Notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

The Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance regulating the operating of ~~six~~ automobiles, auto-cars, autobuses and Jitneys for hire and the transportation of passengers in or through the Town of Milwaukie.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred thirty fifth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Miller, Albee and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The remonstrance of N. B. Harvey, W. S. Threlkeld and M. A. Greb to the improvement of Harvey Street was read, and the Council not deeming the same a valid objection to the improvement, upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance providing for the improvement of said Street.

Ordinance No. 176 entitled "An ordinance providing that Public Utility vehicles shall not be operated in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, except under or by virtue of a franchise given or granted by the Town of Milwaukie, and declaring an emergency, was read and ordered posted.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder to issue improvement bonds to pay a portion of the cost of the improvement of 32nd. Street and post the same as required by the City Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

The two hundred thirty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 16th day of November, 1921. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred thirty-fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 4th day of October, 1921, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the ~~regular~~ two hundred thirty fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 18th day of October, 1921, were read and approved as read. There being no objection made or filed to the estimated budget of ~~the~~ expenditures of the Town of Milwaukie for the year 1922, prepared by the Budget Committee, upon motion duly made and carried, the Budget was adopted as prepared by Budget Committee.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council levied a tax of \$6440.00 upon the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the year 1922, and appropriated said tax as follows:

Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 176 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title ~~only~~ only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Nays, none. Ordinance No. 176 passed. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 177 entitled, "An ordinance providing for the improvement of Harvey Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from a point beginning on the east side of County Road No. 162, and about 593 feet southerly from the northwest corner of the Hector Cambbell D. L. C. Cl. No. 69, thence easterly to the City limits of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and declaring an emergency" was taken up for the first reading.
