MEETING OF OCTOBER 9, 1944

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

614th MEETING

The six hundred fortieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the ninth day of October 1944.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Bevington, McClure, Sperr and Rowe; Water Superintendent Counsell, and Recorder Martin.
Absent: Councilman Newman, Treasurer Walcott, and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the six hundred thirteenth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-fifth day of September 1944, were read and approved as read.

The Mayor announced that Donald J. Burke, of the Public Utilities Commission of Oregon, has requested to use the Auditorium in the City Hall for the evening of Tuesday Oct. 31, for a public hearing. It was agreed that Mr. Burke's request be granted.

Mr. Ray Wolf came before the Council and requested a permit to build a garage at 2305 Washington St. The Recorder was instructed that upon recommendation of the street Commissioner the permit was to be issued.

The Recorder was instructed to write to residents on Monroe St. east of 29th St. and request their presence at the next regular meeting of the Council.

The Recorder was instructed to call for bids for fuel oil for the City Hall and Pump House.

It was moved by McClure and seconded by Rowe that, in order that the land may be put on the tax roll, and owing to the fact that it is of extreme low value on account of being considerably below street level and somewhat inaccessible, the City sell to Harry Dean, its interest in Lot 7 Block 2 Duerst's Addition, for \$5.03. Motion carried and so ordered.

A communication from L.P. Hopkins, superintendent of the Southern Pacific Co., in which he requested that Ordinance No. 81 be repealed as it restricts speed of trains through Milwaukie, was read. The Recorder was directed to write to Mr. Hopkins, stating that Mil-

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waukie was voting on a new charter in November and the matter of old Ordinances would be considered after the election.

Other communications were read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Sperr that the Auditor-Treasurer's report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Rowe that the City purchase two Series "F" War Bonds at \$740.00 each, from the water fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council held on the seventh day of October 1944, were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Sperr that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

MEETING OF OCTOBER 23, 1944

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

615th MEETING

The six hundred fifteenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-third day of October 1944.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Bevington, and Sperr; Treasurer Walcott, Water Superintendent Counsell, Officer Butler and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilmen McClure and Rowe and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the six hundred fourteenth regular meeting of the Council held on the ninth day of October 1944, were read and approved as read.

A number of residents along Monroe street east of 29th street were present in answer to the letter inviting them to attend the meeting. The plans and specifications for the proposed sewer on Monroe street east of 29th street were shown them. Ordinance Number 255, An Ordinance prohibiting outhouses in Milwaukie, was read. Some of the residents already having septic tanks were reluctant to look favorably on the sewer extention. The matter was left to the residents to decide.

Bids for fuel oil for the City Hall and Pump House were opened. The Milwaukie Transfer and Fuel Co. and Milwaukie Oil Co. were the only bidders. It was moved by Newman and seconded by Bevington that the Council accept the bid of the Milwaukie Oil Co. at seller's posted price including tax. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Sperr that the telephone extention from the Fire Phone, in the City office, be disconnected. Motion carried and so ordered.
