The adjourned meeting of the one hundred twenty-seventh (127) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Streib. Present; Mayor Streib, Councilmen Knight, Kelso and Stockton, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Davis.

The minutes of the (126) regular meeting and also of the special meetings of August the 26th, 1912 and October the 8th, 1912, were read and approved as read. The minutes of the special meeting held on the 1st day of October, 1912, were read and ordered corrected and were approved as corrected.

The following bills were allowed and upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Stockton and carried, the Recorder was ordered to draw warrants for the payment of the same:

Upon motion of Councilman Stockton seconded by Councilman Knight and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw two warrants on the general fund in favor of A. G. Long for the chemical engine; one for \$400.00 payable in one year with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum and one for \$350.00 payable in two years with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum.

The estimate of the work done on the Foster Road by the Rockolite Contracting Company to the amount of \$4470.58, as reported by the Engineer, was read and upon motion of Councilman Kelso seconded by Councilman Stockton and carried the recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the general improvement fund of Foster Road for the same.

Moved by Councilman Kelso and seconded by Councilman Stockton that ordinance NO. 79 be taken up for the first reading. Carried. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: ayes Councilmen Kelso, Stockton and Knight. naves none. Absent Councilman Lehman. Moved by councilman Stockton and seconded by Councilman Kelso that the ordinary rules be suspended and that ordinance No. 79 be taken up for the second reading. Carried. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes Councilmen Kelso, Knight and Stockton. Naves none. Absent Councilman Lehman.

Moved by Councilman Stockton and seconded by Councilman Knight that the ordinary rules be suspended and that ordinance No. 79 be taken up for the third and final reading. Carried. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes Councilmen Kelso, Knight and Stockton. Naves none. Absent Councilman Lehman. Ordinance No. 79 Passed.

Upon motion of Councilman Kelso and seconded by Councilman Knight and carried, ordinance No. 80 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes Councilman Kelso, Knight and Stockton. Naves none. Absent Councilman Lehman. Moved by Councilman Stockton and seconded by Councilman Knight that the ordinary rules be suspended and that ordinance No. 80 be taken up for the second reading. Carried. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes Councilman Kelso, Knight and Stockton. Naves none. Absent Councilman Lehman. Moved by Councilman Knight and seconded by Councilman Kelso that the ordinary rules be suspended and that ordinance No. 80 be taken up for the third and final reading. Carried. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes Councilman Kelso, Knight and Stockton. Naves none. Absent Councilman Lehman. Ordinance No. 80 passed.

Upon motion of Councilman Knight and seconded by Councilman Stockton and carried, the claim of William Shindler for damages to his property alleged to have been caused by the widening of Harrison Street was disallowed. Upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Kelso and carried, the time of the Rockolite Contracting Company for completing the improvement of Foster Road was extended until the 15th day of November, 1912.

Upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Stockton and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a resolution declaring the building ^{No. 4 - 1912} on Washington Street owned by T. R. A. Sellwood to be a public nuisance on the account of the unsafe and dangerous condition of the foundation of said building.

Upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Stockton and carried, the following persons were appointed to serve as judges and clerks of the city election to be held on the 5th day of November, 1912: Judges, F. H. Lechler, Jas. Johnson and J. H. Snyder; Clerks, W. E. Kelso and Leslie Harlow.

The Marshal was instructed to post notices of the Convention to be held in the Town Hall on Thursday the 24th day of October, 1912.

Upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Stockton and carried, ordinance No. 81 entitled, "An ordinance regulating the speed of railroad trains, street cars, motor cars, locomotives, vehicles, automobiles, automobile-trucks or other motor vehicles within the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukee, and providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of the same," was read and ordered changed by inserting the words "twelve miles per hour" instead of eight miles per hour and "fifteen miles per hour" instead of ten miles per hour and was ordered posted when changed.

No further business coming before the council moved and seconded that the council adjourn. Carried.
