

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, OCT. 13TH. 1931.

The three hundred-fifty-fifth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 13th. day of October, 1931. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Dean and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fifty-fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th. day of September, 1931, were read and approved as read. Councilman Dell of the Street Committee reported that the repairs on Main Street were finished, except the skin patching. Councilman Dell also that some of the Street signs furnished by the Oregon State Motor Association had been torn down and that one of the guilty parties was known to the Marshal, but no arrest had been made. The City Marshal stated that he had sufficient evidence to convict one of the guilty parties but was waiting to secure evidence against the other guilty parties before making an arrest. The City Marshal was instructed to take care of the matter. A petition requesting the Council to pave Monroe Street across Spring Creek was read and laid on the table as the City had no funds for paving. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineering was instructed to proceed with putting in a curb and gutter on Monroe Street near Mr. Bubank's property, as outlined, in order to take care of the drainage.

A petition of 103 voters in the Ardenwald District advising the Council that they were in favor of annexing the Ardenwald District to Milwaukie was read and laid on the table until the next regular meeting of the Council.

Mr. Grasle was present and informed the Council that Lake Road was badly in need of repairs and should be re-surfaced as soon possible.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to make a preliminary estimate of the cost of re-surfacing Lake Road and Part of Harrison Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the following persons were appointed on the Budget Committee; S. S. Fields, W. H. Grasle; A. J. Walker; G. C. Pelton and M. J. Walsh. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the pavement on Main Street between Monroe Street and Jefferson Street and at the intersection of Main Street and Harrison Street and on Harrison Street from 23rd. Street easterly to S. P. Co crossing, be repaired. Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposed ordinance granting to Pacific Garbage Removal Company a franchise to collect garbage in Milwaukie as amended was ordered posted as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was allowed \$5.00 to pay his expenses to Astoria to attend the Northwest Peace Officers Association.
