

MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 22, 1941.
(Cont'd)

A communication from the League of Clackamas County Cities was read.

A communication from F.I.Roth, district office Engineer of Federal Works Agency W.P.A. of Oregon, showing the approval of the Water Storage Tank Project for Milwaukie, was read.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Kemmerer that an Ordinance be drawn whereby one Show House only will be allowed a building permit until the population of Milwaukie exceeds 3500. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor appointed the following committee to be in charge of ways and means of financing the Library for six months. Mr. W.Rowe, Mr. S.Peake, Mr. F.Sperr, and Mr. G.Makin.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Sperr that the Recorder post an Ordinance to provide for the tax levy for the first six months of 1942. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Makin that four hundred dollars (\$400.00) be transferred from Supervision to Construction in the Street fund and that seventy dollars (\$70.00) be transferred from Stenographic Expenses in the General fund to Social Welfare Fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Kemmerer that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrents for the payment of same.

MEETING OF OCTOBER 13, 1941.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

543rd.COUNCIL.

The five hundred forty-third regular meeting of the Council was held on the thirteenth day of October 1941.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Makin, Walden, Sperr, and Kemmerer; Water Superintendant Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon, Police Officer Burbank, Attorney Adams, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the five hundred forty-second regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-second day of September 1941, were read and approved as read.

The Council agreed that in view of the fact that Milwaukie plans to construct a Water Storage Tank, and that materials are difficult to get, Attorney Adams be directed to seek priority rights, for the City's needs, in Washington D.C.

Mr. Makin reported that the doorway of the Club room in the City Hall basement was too narrow for double swing doors, and too wide for a single swing door. Mrs Newman was appointed to get estimated cost of drapery and fittings for a curtain for the doorway.

Mr. Makin reported that the School Board of School District No. 1 had offered the City free use of their power lawn mower.

Mr. Kunesmiller laid before the Council, a blue print of Boly's Addition to the City of Milwaukie, the Council agreed they would accept 36th street Boly's Addn. provided it was graded 60 feet in width and graveled 16 feet wide and 6 inches thick, and requested that Boly's Addition be Platted.

A communication was read in which Earl Riley, Mayor of Portland, invited the Mayor and Fire Chief to attend a meeting in Portland, October 14, with regards to a proposed "Black Out" for October 31, 1941. It was agreed that Mayor Roberts and Fire Chief Lewellyn would attend the meeting.

It was moved by Kemmerer and seconded by Makin that Fire Chief Lewellyn be permitted to use the upstairs meeting room in the City Hall for his First Aid classes in Civil Defence work. Motion carried and so ordered.

A Petition, signed by residents of Milwaukie, requesting that an Arc light be placed at 40th and Llewellyn streets, was read. It was decided that no new Arc lights would be installed until after the first of the year.

The Auditor's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Kemmerer that the Water deposit and Sewer connection question, with regards to the United States Housing Project in Milwaukie, be tabled until the next regular meeting of the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Sperr that the Council permit the County to sell Lot 10 Block 44 Minthorne Addn. for the sum of Forty dollars (\$40.00) the County to deduct nine dollars and twenty-six cents (\$9.26) for taxes. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Walden that the City sell Lot 18 Block 73 Minthorne Addn, to Mr. Joe Bernard for the sum of forty-three dollars and sixty-six cents (\$43.66) Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Sperr that the City place a "No Dumping of Refuse" sign at the north end of 24th street. Motion carried and so ordered.

The cross walk at 29th and Washington streets was reported to be in bad condition. The Street Commissioner was requested to take care of the necessary repair of this cross walk.

The sidewalk under the Southern Pacific Company's trestle on Lake Road was reported as being covered with mud. The Recorder was directed to write to the Southern Pacific Co. and request them to clean the walk.

Ordinance number 416, AN ORDINANCE providing a tax levy on all taxable property within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for City purposes for the first six months of the year One Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-two (1942), was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance number 416 was laid on the table until the next regular meeting of the Council.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Newman that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrents for the payment of same.
