

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, SEPT. 9TH 1913.

The one hundred thirty-eight (138) regular meeting of the town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen King, Mitchell, Davis, Albee and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the one hundred thirty-seventh (137) regular meeting held on the 12th day of August, 1913, and the adjourned meeting of the one hundred thirty-seventh, (137) regular meeting held on the 19th day of August, 1913, also the minutes of the call meeting held on the 2nd day of September, 1913, were read and approved as read.

The following bills were read and allowed and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

- D. P. Mathews for salary and preparing ordinance No. 94 \$28.00
- A. L. Reed, salary..... 45.00
- P. R. L. & P. Co., for lighting fire house..... .32
- P. R. L. & P. Co., lighting for August..... 116.67.

There being no objections to the report of the viewers on the proposed extension of Laurel Avenue, and said report appearing to the Council to be in all respects reasonable and just, upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw an ordinance embodying said report. Ordinance No. 94 entitled "An ordinance establishing the grades of Monroe Street from the east line of Main Street to 2a Shindler Street or Patton Avenue in Milwaukie, Oregon; repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted.

A petition of residents of Robertson requesting to be annexed to Milwaukie was read and referred to the City Attorney to be reported upon at the next regular meeting.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the vote on ordinance No. 93 was post-poned until the next meeting. The petition of the residents of South Milwaukie requesting the Council to pass an ordinance compelling the P. R. L. & P. Co., to make a stop at Front and Washington Streets to let off and take on passengers, and also erect a depot was read and referred to the Street Committee.

A petition requesting the Council to revoke the liquor license granted to the Milwaukie Tavern was read. Moved by councilman Albee and seconded by councilman Davis that the liquor license granted Isaac Gratton be revoked.

Moved by councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King that all proceedings regarding the granting of a liquor license to the Milwaukie Club be expunged from the minutes of the last meeting. Carried. Mayor Elmer and councilmen Mitchell and Counsell informed the council of their intention of resigning their respective offices. Moved and seconded that meeting adjourn. Carried.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, OCTOBER 14TH. 1913.

The one hundred thirty-ninth (139) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present Mayor Elmer, Councilmen Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Bolstad and Marshal Reed.

Mayor Elmer and Councilmen Mitchell and Counsell stated that owing to the petition of a majority of the legal voters requestin them to remain in office, that they had reconsidered their intention of resigning, and would continue in their respective offices. The minutes of the one hundred thirty-eight (138) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie were read and approved as read. The following bills were read

and allowed by the Finance committee, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by Councilman Albee and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

- The City Engineers Monthly estimate No. 1 of the work done by

the Montague-O'Reilly on Front Street amounting to \$11,512.50, was read and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Front Street Fund, in favor of the Montague-O'Reilly Company, for \$9,785.63, the same being 85% of the estimate. A communication, Montague-O'Reilly Company regarding extra work done on Front Street was read and ordered placed on file. The assessment for Foster Road was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to post notices of the assessment as required by the Charter. The Report of the viewers on the proposed widening of Harrison Street was read and referred to the Street Committee.

Ordinance No. 94 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 94 passed the first reading. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 94 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-called showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 94 passed the second reading.

Upon motion of Councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 94 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 94 passed the third and final reading.

Ordinance No. 95 entitled "An ordinance establishing the grades of De Witt Street in Milwaukie, Oregon; repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted.

Ordinance No. 96 entitled "An ordinance adopting the report of the viewers on the proposed extension of Laurel Avenue from the east line of Blaine Street to a point in the northeasterly line of an unnamed street parallel to the railroad track of the Southern Pacific Company and lying northeasterly therefrom, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted. Ordinance No. 93 was taken up for discussion and upon motion of councilman Mitchell duly seconded and carried the term "40 years" was changed to 25 years. Upon motion of councilman Davis seconded by councilman Albee and carried ordinance No. 93 was laid on the table.

The Treasurer's report was read and ordered placed on file. A petition of the property owners along Shindler, asking the City to install an arc light on Shindler Street was read and referred to the light committee.

Councilman A. C. Davis handed in his resignation as councilman of the Town of Milwaukie, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell, and carried the resignation of Mr. Davis was accepted. The Mayor declared nominations were in order to select a councilman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Davis.

Councilman Mitchell placed Mr. H. F. Loeding in nomination. There being no other nominations, the nomination were declared closed. The result of the vote being in doubt, the roll-call was called for. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell and Counsell. Nays, King and Albee. The vote being a tie, the Mayor cast his vote in favor of Mr. Loeding. Mr. Loeding was duly declared to be elected as councilman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Davis.

Upon motion duly made and carried the council adjourned subject to the call of the mayor.
