

The three hundred thirty-first regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 14th. day of October, 1929. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Shindler, Dean, Dell and Earl, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 297 entitled, "An ordinance providing for the construction of a sewer in Myrtle Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, from the present manhole at the intersection of Elmer and Myrtle Streets northeasterly to a point five feet northeasterly of the southwesterly corner of Lot 30, Block 2 Robert's Re-plat of J. R. W. Sellwood's Addition to Milwaukie, and declaring an emergency;" was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 297 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 297 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 297 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 297 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 297 passed the third and final reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 298 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Charter of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the amendments thereto, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 298 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 298 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, None. Ordinance No. 298 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 298 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, None. Ordinance No. 298 passed the third and final reading. The report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Treasurer was ordered to transfer \$2000.00 from the water fund to the General fund, and to place the balance of the money on hand in the water fund in a savings account. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of the Myrtle Street sewer in the Daily Journal of Commerce, said bids to be opened on the 28th. day of October, 1929. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that Clackamas County be sent a bill for \$150.00 for patching the pavement of the Market Road in Milwaukie. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
