


SPECIAL MEETING OF OCTOBER 17, 1966

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

A special meeting of the Council was held at the call of the Mayor on the 17th day of October, 1966, for the purpose of holding public hearings and any such other business to come before the Council at this time.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Robert Richmond, with the following Councilmen present:

It was moved by Howard, seconded by Slominski, that the minutes of the regular meeting of October 10, 1966 be approved as written. Motion carried and so ordered.

RECOMMENDATION - State Highway Department

Letter from the State Highway Department dated October 13, 1966 was reviewed by the Council, with their recommendations for improving the safety of the intersection at 21st and Lake Road by a 7-foot curb set back on the northerly side of Lake Road between 21st and Willard Street. Also suggested the installation of a flashing beacon, with the City paying 50% of the installation cost and accepting power costs and maintenance.

It was moved by Howard, seconded by Graf, that the City Manager be authorized to proceed with the suggested recommendations and that a

complete estimate of the cost involved be prepared and a report made to the Council at the October 24 meeting. Motion carried and so ordered.

REPORT

Max Thompson, Assistant Manager, reported on the recent meeting of the Clackamas Water District wherein, speaking on behalf of the City, he requested purchase of water from Clackamas Water District to the Cedarcrest area.

Manager advised that he had been informed by Clackamas Water District that they would be willing to sell water to the City of Milwaukie to service the Cedarcrest area only at 17¢ per 100 cu. ft.

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Howard, that the City of Milwaukie enter into an agreement with Clackamas Water District for the purchase of water at the rate of 17¢ per 100 cu. ft. for servicing the Cedarcrest development only. Motion carried and so ordered.

LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL

A request for liquor license renewal for Vic's Tavern, 1049 McLoughlin Blvd., was presented to the Council. It was requested by the Council that a written recommendation for the Police Department be obtained before action is taken.

REPORT ON CRAG

Dr. Howard reported on the recent meeting of CRAG and advised that officers were elected to serve until January 1, 1967.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Public hearing was opened by the Mayor at 8:00 p.m., on the question of laying asphaltic concrete from 40th and Drake to the new extension at the south end of 38th Street. Notices posted in accordance with Res. 45-1966, with the hearing held at the time and place specified in said notice.

Mr. Bill Wallace, Action Realty, questioned whether it would be necessary for owners of newly purchased homes on 38th Street to be assessed for this street improvement, as the builder of their homes put in asphaltic concrete in front of their property at the time of construction.

It was explained that owners in the area would be assessed only for the materials used in the laying of asphaltic concrete, not to exceed \$70.00, rather than including the costs, to be borne by the City, involved in the construction of dry wells and other work also being done to remedy the drainage problem. One cost approximately offsetting the other.

No one else wishing to be heard, the hearing was declared closed.

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Graf, that Ord. No. 1136 (Providing for improvement of Drake Street and 38th Street) be taken up for its first reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

City Engineer pointed out an error in the Ordinance and advised that the assessed properties listed in Section 3 should read:

"All the lots and parcels of lots abutting S. E. Drake Street westerly from S. E. 40th Street to S. E. 38th Street, thence southerly from Drake Street to southerly terminus of 38th Street."

It was moved by Howard, seconded by Graf, that Ord. No. 1136 be amended to show the correction made by the City Engineer. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Howard, seconded by Graf, that Ord. No. 1136 be moved to its second reading, as amended, at the next regular meeting of the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

Public hearing was opened on the question of amending Ord. No. 481, by creating residential zone 3-R-1, special use. Notices published and posted in compliance with Resolution No. 46-1966, with the hearing held at the time and place specified in said notice.

As there was no one present wishing to speak on the proposed change, the hearing was declared closed.

It was moved by Howard, seconded by Graf, that Ord. No. 1131 (Amending Ord. No. 481) be taken up for its first reading. Motion carried and so ordered.


