MEETING OF NOVEMBER 10, 1952

Council Chambers

808th Meeting

The eight hundred eighth regular meeting of the Council was held on the tenth day of November, 1952.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Meeting of November 10, 1952 - Cont.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Taylor, Klein and Norbeck; Manager Sperr; Attorney Kirkpatrick, Treasurer Dillery and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred seventh regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-seventh day of October, were approved as written.

Mr. Bob Malloy came before the Council with regard to license fee for gaming devices. The City's present ordinance calls for \$25.00 per month for gaming devices and \$2.50 per month for amusement devices. After some discussion it was decided that Attorney Kirkpatrick, Manager Sperr and Mr. Malloy would get together to arrange an amendment to the ordinance.

Manager Sperr laid before the Council information etc. of a Sand Spreader for use in the Street Department. The Council approved the purchase of this piece of equipment.

The recorder announced that this was the time and place for the hearing on the matter of the annexation of the Amber Richardson property, to the City. The Mayor called for objections to this annexation. There were no objections. It was moved by Norbeck seconded by Klein that the Amber Richardson property be annexed to the City of Milwaukie and that an ordinance be written declaring the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Sperr laid before the Council an application for permit to build a gravel processing plant at 1922 McLoughlin Blvd. The permit was requested by Gregson and Herb, 1222 McLoughlin Blvd. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Norbeck that this matter be referred to the Planning Commission for their approval and recommendation. Motion carried and so ordered.

Fire Chief Lillis came before the Council and reported that, due to a hearing resulting from a fire on Harmony Road in the Rural Fire Protection District, he had learned that the district had no section in their by-laws which prohibited the kindling of fires without a fire permit, and advised that if and when the Rural Fire District renewed their contract with the City, that the City should require that they (Rural Fire District) have the same requirements for permits as the City now has.

Two applications for recommendation for renewals of liquor licenses were read as follows:

Herman Suehlisen for Main Street Cafe--P.B.(Package Store Class B) and R.M.B.A.(Retail Malt Beverage ClassA.)
Ernest McLaughlin for Mac's Pit. R.M.B.A.(Retail Malt Beverage)

A letter from Police Chief Delp was read in which he approved renewals for the following places in Milwaukie, Vic's Tavern, Mac's Pit and Main Street Cafe. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Norbeck that renewal recommendations be granted to Vic's Tavern, Main Street Cafe and Mac's Pit. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Klein that the following bills be allowed and that warrant-checks be drawn for their payment.

SPECIAL MEETING OF NOVEMBER 19, 1952
