

MEETING OF NOVEMBER 12, 1956

COUNCIL CHAMBER

904th MEETING.

The nine hundred fourth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the twelvth day of November, 1956.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan, Councilmen Perkins, Shook and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Clay.

The minutes of the nine hundred third regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-second day of October, 1956, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-ninth day of October, 1956, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the seventh day of November, 1956, were approved as written.

Mr. R.J. Wisner, 3325 Wister Street, came before the Council and requested that " STOP " signs be placed at the intersection of 34th and Wister Streets, stopping all north and south vehicular traffic before entering Wister Street. The matter was referred to the Traffic Committee.

Mr. Morris Martin, laid before the Council a petition protesting the placing of a Bowling Alley on Tax Lot 40, Whitcomb D.L.C. The petition was signed by thirty-five property owners residing along Monroe Street, Railroad Avenue, Myrtle Street and Harrison Street. It was moved by Perkins and seconded by Klein that the Recorder refer the matter of this zone change for Tax Lot 40, Whitcomb D.L.C. to the Planning Commission to be checked for sufficiency, in accordance with paragraph 3 of Section 9 of Ordinance No. 481. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder laid before the Council, twenty-three applications with consent to annexation to the City, signed by owners of properties in Bonnie View Acres and Rockwood Acres, and contiguous to the City of Milwaukie. It was moved by Perkins and seconded by Shook, that the necessary procedure be taken to annex these properties. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 657, AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 481, as amended by Ordinance 559, and as further amended by Ordinance No. 624 so as to change the boundaries of certain zones established by said Ordinance No 481 as so amended by adding thereto certain territories annexed to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, since the enactment of said Ordinance No. 481 was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had; Ayes: Mullan, Perkins, Shook and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 657 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A petition, signed by eight residents in the immediate vicinity of 38th and Drake Streets, requesting that a street lamp be placed at the corner of 38th and Drake Streets was read and referred to the City Manager.

The Police Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

A letter from James & Yost, Inc., Sub Contractors for Don Thornton, with regard to the Lift Station for the Keil Heights sewer extension, was read. The letter pointed out difficulties encountered in construction of the Lift Station, on account of striking a stream of water flowing through the bottom of the sump, which had to be shut off at much unforeseen expense. James & Yost were asking for re-imbusement from the City and gave an itemized list of costs totaling \$3,153.60 as re-imbusement requested. The Council requested Manager Burdick to furnish the Engineers, Stevens and Thompson, with a copy of the letter and decided against any further action pending recommendation from them (Stevens & Thompson).

A report from Stevens & Thompson, of progress of the Keil-Walsh sewer extension, was read. The report recommended that the Contractor, Don Thornton, be paid for work completed to date totaling, after deductions, \$13,537.18

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It was moved by Klein and seconded by Perkins that Mr. Thornton be paid at this time, \$13,537.18, as recommended by the Engineers. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of stand-by charges for sprinkling system, generally used for fire protection in industrial plants, was discussed. Manager Burdick reported that he had been investigating these charges made by other cities. No action was taken by the Council.

Manager Burdick reported that the Junior Chamber of Commerce were planning to decorate the business section of the City for Christmas and that they had invited the City to participate in the program. There was discussion and suggestions with result being that Manager Burdick get more information as to what would be needed.

It was moved by Perkins and seconded by Klein that the following bills be approved and that warrants be drawn for the payment of same.
