

## MEETING OF OCTOBER 24, 1955 (Cont'd)

Manager Burdick reported that he had written to Cushing Brothers informing them that as soon as Cushing Brothers were ready to start work on the 34th st sidewalks removing and replacing as directed by manager, an inspector would be provided for them by the city to work with them.

Future plans on the extension of Main Street were discussed, manager Burdick reported that he would meet with Mr. Chandler of the State Highway Dept., along with Mr. J.E. Jones and Mayor Leonard Mullan.

Mr. Burdick also reported that the army agreed to re-inspect another area for an army site.

Mr. Burdick recommended that the City purchase some aerial photographs of Milwaukee from Delano Photographers in the amount of \$25.00. This recommendation was tabled until the council could inspect same.

Mr. Burdick recommended that the city share the cost of installing a storm drain at 33rd and Harvey, which was installed by Mr. Perkins. City share to cost in the amount of \$100.00. It was decided to table the matter for council inspection.

Attorney John O. Sheldahl suggested that the city parking ordinance be redesigned and was given approval to proceed with redesigning the ordinance.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

## MEETING OF NOVEMBER 14, 1955

COUNCIL CHAMBER

880th MEETING

The eight hundred eightieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the fourteenth day of November, 1955

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Shook and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin. Absent: None.

The minutes of the eight hundred seventy-ninth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-fourth day of October, 1955, were approved as written.

Application, made by Mal A. and Winifred E. Rolfson, for recommendation for a Class "A" Dispensers license (liquor served with meals) was again laid before the Council. Councilman Clay stated that he had viewed the premises and that the proposed dining room, where this service would be given, was a basement room and appeared to be small. Mr. Rolfson stated that he had not made the improvements necessary as he did not wish to go to that expense until he knew if or not he would be granted the dispensers license, also that all alterations would be made according to the requirements set forth by the Liquor Control Commission, but he was very sure that he would have table room for seventy persons. The Council discussed the matter and took into consideration the fact that Milwaukee was growing and that this type of dispensers were on each side of the city along the highway. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that the recommendation be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

## MEETING OF NOVEMBER 14, 1955.(Cont'd)

A letter, from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, in which they recommended that Lot 22, the E'ly 5 feet of Lot 2 and the W'ly 4.7' by 200' by 6.39' of Lot 21 all in Block 1, Leo's First Addition, be changed from Zone 3 R-2 Special to Commercial Zone, was read. The letter stated that proper investigation had been made and all things were in order. It was moved by Clay and seconded by Klein that the Council accept the recommendation of the Planning Commission and that Ordinance Number 481 be amended by an ordinance to this effect. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Burdick reported that rocking and graveling had been done on Washington Street and 46th Street north of Washington Street in Martin Heights, and gave an itemized report of the cost of same, also the cost which was chargeable to Martin and requested that he be authorized to bill Martin for same. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that M.C. Martin be billed in the amount of \$392.66 for his share of the above mentioned work and materials. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Police Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed

The matter of the City sharing the cost of a dry well in 33rd Street, Roseland Addition, was discussed. Manager Burdick explained that the dry well had been put in by Mr. Perkins, who is developing Roseland Addition, and had proved satisfactory during recent rains, and that the City had been saved the expense of lowering the grade of Harvey Street to take care of storm drainage. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that the City pay \$100.00 as its share of the cost of the dry well in 33rd Street Roseland Addition. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that the following bills be approved and that warrants be drawn for the payment of same.

## MEETING OF NOVEMBER 28, 1955.

COUNCIL CHAMBER

881st. MEETING

The eight hundred eighty-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-eighth day of November, 1955.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Shook and Klein; Manager Burdick and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Clay and Attorney Sheldahl.

The minutes of the eight hundred eightieth regular meeting of the Council, held on the fourteenth day of November, 1955, were approved as written

A letter from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, admonishing City Councils against automatic recommendations for renewal of liquor licenses, was read.

There were two applications for recommendations for renewal of liquor licenses laid before the Council. Safeway Stores requested recommendation for renewal of "P.B." license (Package Store Class B.) Lew's Market, 32nd and Harrison Streets, made application for recommendation for renewal of "P.B." (Package Store Class B.) It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that both recommendations be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

A group of citizens, owning property along 34th Street Quincy Addition, came before the Council and again remonstrated against any assessment being levied for the curbs and sidewalks, laid by Cushing Bros., until the sidewalks had been brought to conform with specifications as set forth in the contract. Manager Burdick reported that Cushing Bros. had agreed to remove and replace the walks where necessary, and that they would do the work as soon as the weather permitted this type of work.

Ordinance Number 624 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that Ordinance Number 624 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.
