

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOV. 4TH. 1920.

The two hundred twenty-fourth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 4th day of Nov. 1920. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Grasle, Miller, Hart and Counsell, recorder Mathews and marshal Reed.

The Minutes of the 223rd regular meeting of the Council held on the 5th day of October, 1920, and the minutes of the special meeting held on the 8th day of October, 1920, were read and approved as read. The canvas of the votes cast at the general election held on the 2nd day of November, 1920, showed the following results;

For Mayor:
J. W. Bates..... 118 votes
John M. Snyder..... 219

Total number of votes cast for mayor 337
John M. Snyder having received the greatest number of votes was duly declared elected mayor of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, to serve for a period of two years.

For Recorder:
David P. Mathews..... 324 votes.
Total number of votes cast for Recorder 324
David P. Mathews having received all the votes cast for recorder was duly declared elected Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, to serve for a period of two years.

For Treasurer:

Philip Streib having received all the votes cast for Treasurer was duly declared to be elected Treasurer of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, to serve for a period of two years.

Ray Albee having received a majority of votes cast for Councilman At Large was duly declared to be elected councilman at large of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, to serve for a period of two years.

A. L. Reed having received a majority of votes cast for marshal was duly declared to be elected marshal of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, to serve for a period of two years.

J. J. Miller having received a majority of votes cast for Councilman was duly declared elected councilman for ward #1 to serve for a period of four years.

Total number of votes cast for Councilman 125
Leo Shindler having received the greatest number of votes for Councilman was duly declared elected councilman for Ward #2 to serve for a period of four years.

Ordinance number 171 entitled, "An ardinance regulating the driving and operating of vehicles within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon; repealing ordinances No. 132 and 167; providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance and declaring an emergency", was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Grasle, Miller, Hart and Counsell. nays, None. Ordinance No. 171 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 171 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Grasle, Miller, Hart and Counsell. nays, None. Ordinance No. 171 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 171 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Grasle, Miller, Hart and Counsell. nays, none. Ordinance No. 171 passed. Ordinance No. 172 entitled, "An ordinance prohibiting the picketing or staking out of live stock in, or the use in any manner as a pasture for live stock, of the streets, alleys or public highways in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon; repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith and providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions hereof", was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter.

The Mayor informed the council that he had appointed Frank Arrighi a member of the Boxing Commission to succeed C. A. Passet, resigned. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council confirmed the appointment of Frank Arrighi as a member of the Boxing Commission. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DECEMBER 7TH, 1920.

The two hundred twenty-fifth (225) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 7th day of December, 1920.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Albee, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the two hundred twenty-fourth regular meeting of the Council held the 4th day of November, 1920 were read and approved as read. Mr. Counsell of the Street Committee reported that they had repaired Milwaukie Highway and Lake Road, and had used all the asphalt in doing so.

A petition requesting the council to install an arc light at the intersection Monroe Street with the Willsburg Cutoff was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co to install an arc light on the first pole west of the intersection of Monroe Street with the Reaverton and Willburg Railroad. The petition of John Bernards Pastor of the Catholic Church requesting the permission to lay an underground drain along the southerly side of Monroe Street from the northwest corner of the property on which the Catholic Church is situated, easterly about 220 feet to the creek which crosses Monroe Street was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the request was granted. Professor Wakefield was present and requested the use of the City Hall for his physical training class as he did not have room enough at school house.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the request of Professor Wakefield was granted, provided no damage was done to the City Hall, and provided that he had the Hall cleaned each time after using the same. Mr Cunningham and Mr. Stafford was present and objected to the passage of ordinance No. 172, for the reason that it would work a hardship on the people of Minthorn. Upon motion duly made and carried, the passage of ordinance No. 172 was put over until the next meeting of the Council. Up motion duly made and carried, Mr. Albee was appointed a committee of one to interview the property owners along Harrison Street extension and ascertain, if possible, what the property owners want for that the Town would have to appropriate in order to open the street.
