

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOV. 9TH. 1931.

The three hundred fifty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 9th. day of November, 1931. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fifty-fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 13th day of October, 1931, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 312 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders and Dean. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 312 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 312 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Sanders, Shindler and Dean. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 312 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 312 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 313 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, and Dean. Noes, none. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 313 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to execute a quitclaim deed on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, conveying all the right and title of the Town of Milwaukie in and to Lot 4, Block 41, Minthorn Addition to the City of Portland, to Leslie Mugg and Lydia K. Mugg, upon the payment of \$12.00. Upon motion duly made and carried, the petition for the annexation of the Ardenwald District to Milwaukie was laid on the table indefinitely. Mr. Shrock representing the Milwaukie Business Men's Club stated that the Committee on the relief of the unemployed had raised about \$700.00 and expected to raise \$1000.00 and that the Business Men's Club wanted the Council to donate a similar sum and put the item in the City Budget for 1932. Mr. Shrock was informed that the budget had already been prepared, and that if it became necessary for the City to contribute to the relief fund the matter could be taken up later. The resignation of J. B. Earl as Councilman at large was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the resignation of J. B. Earl as Councilman at large of Milwaukie, Oregon, was accepted. Upon motion duly made and carried, F. E. Bevington was appointed Councilman at large for Milwaukie, Oregon, to fill the unexpired term of Mr. J. B. Earl.
