MEETING OF NOVEMBER 9, 1942.

COUNCIL CHAMBER

569th MEETING

The five hundred sixty-ninth regular meeting of the Council was held on the ninth day of November 1942.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Bevington, Walden, Sperr and Kemmerer; Attorney Adams, Treasurer Farrington, Water Superintendent Hofmann, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Officer Burbank, Marshal Rigdon, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Newman.

The minutes of the five hundred sixty-eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-sixth day of October 1942 were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that the Council approve the minutes of the special meeting held, for the purpose of canvassing the votes of election, on November 4, 1942. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of vacating Penzance street north of Monroe street was discussed and it was decided that the Council would make a study of the Plat of Wilson Acres before proceeding further.

A communication from Wm. Hofmann, in which he asked for a leave of absence for the duration of the war, was read. It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that Mr. Hofmann's request be granted and that he be re-instated as Water Superintendent upon his return from service in the Navy. Motion carried and so ordered.

A communication from W.J. Avison, secretary of the Housing Authority of Clackamas County, in which was stated that rumors to the effect that Kellogg Park, north of Milwaukie, would be turned into a settlement for Negro War workers, were false and unfounded, was read.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Walden that Mr. Sperr be authorized to accept the offer made by Mr. Fromeier, of the State Highway Commission, to repair Jefferson street from Main St. to 99E. and Harrison Street from Main street to Miller drive. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Bevington that the Water Commissioner and Superintendent be authorized to have the floor of the pump house repaired. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Iver Tolstead appeared before the Council and made request for a building permit to put an addition on the building now occupied by Milwaukie Cafe. He stated that on account of shortage of building materials he could not at this time put up a permanent structure, but at the expiration of the war the entire building would be demolished. It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Walden that the Council grant Mr. Tolstead a permit to construct a temporary addition, of approximately 12 feet in width, to the Milwaukie Cafe building provided, however, that the same is demolished within 120 days after the duration of the war. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Walden that all war effort expenditures be paid out of the War Emergency fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr Burbank reported that he had made repeated reports to the Portland General Electric Co. as to street lights being out but that he had gotten no response in many cases and that one light at 23rd and Willard streets had been out since October 19. The Recorder was directed to withhold payment of the current street lighting bill and write a letter to the Electric Company stating why the payment was withheld.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Kemmerer that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
