

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOV. 10TH. 1914.

The one hundred fifty-second regular meeting of the Town Council of the town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed and Treasurer Polstad. The minutes of the one hundred fifty-first regular meeting held on the 13th day of October, 1914, and the minutes of the adjourned meetings of the regular one hundred fifty-first meeting held on the 20th, 23rd, 30th, of October, 1914, and on the 4th day of November, 1914, were read and approved as read.

The following bills were allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the acceptance of the improvement of Monroe Street was postponed until the 28th day of November, 1914.

There being no objection to the proposed assessment for the improvement of Harrison Street, upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by Councilman Counsell, and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw an ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of said Street and post the same as required by the City Charter. The report of the Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the Treasurer was instructed to transfer \$400.00 from the Foster Road fund to the general fund; \$350.00 from Laurel Avenue fund to the general fund and \$800.00 from the Front Street Fund to the general fund. The report of the Fire Commission was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, the tax levy for the coming year was fixed at 8 mills. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Fire Commission was authorized to seal the Fast Milwaukie Fire Station.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 117 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 117 passed the first reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 117 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. ways, none. Ordinance No. 117 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 117 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 117 passed the third and final reading. Ordinance No. 114) granting the Portland & Oregon City railroad a franchise was read and referred to the Street Committee with instruction to revise the same and post a copy thereof as required by the City Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned until the 16th day of November, 1914.
