

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOVEMBER 12TH, 1912.

The one hundred twenty-eighth (128) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Streib. Present, Mayor Streib, Councilmen Kelso, Knight, Lehman and Stockton, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Davis.

The minutes of the adjourned meeting of the (127) regular meeting hold on the 11th day of October, 1912, and also the minutes of the special meeting held on the 7th day of October, 1912, were read and approved as read. Upon motion of Councilman Lehman seconded by councilman Knight and carried, the following bills were allowed and the Recorder instructed to draw warrants on the General Fund for the payment of the same:

Moved by councilman Kelso and seconded by councilman Stockton that the ordinary rules be suspended and that ordinance No. 81 be taken up for the third and final reading. Carried.

The ordinance being read, the roll call showed the following results:

Ordinance Number 81 passed.

Upon motion of Councilman Stockton seconded by Councilman Knight and carried, the recorder was instructed to notify the property owners on the south side of Jefferson Street between Front and main streets of the dangerous and unsafe condition of the side walk along their property and to notify them to repair the side walk and put it in a safe condition.

Upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by councilman Lehman and carried, the Recorder was instructed to write to D. W. Campbell of the Southern Pacific Company and notify him that unless the Company put in the overhead crossing at Foster Road immediately, the Council would take the necessary action to compel the Company to do so.

No further business coming before the Council moved and second that the Council adjourn. Carried.
