The three hundred thirty-second regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 12th. day of November, 1929. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Wiseman and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred thirtieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 9th. day of September, 1929, also the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 16th. day of January, 1929, and the minutes of the three hundred thirty-first regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th. day of October, 1929, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the three hundred thirty-first regular of the Council held on the 28th. day of October, 1929, were read and approved as read. The objection of Mary D. Woodward to proposed assessment against her property for the improvement of Willard Street was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the objection was over-ruled, except as to the additional engineering charge of \$25.00 against the improvement, over and above the 5% allowed by City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to re-apportion the proposed assessment for the improvement of Willard Street by deducting the sum of \$45.00 therefrom, and to reapportion the proposed assessment for the improvement of East Jefferson Street by deducting therefrom the sum of \$25.00. There being no objections made to the estimated budget of expenditures of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the year 1930, by the Budget Committee, upon motion duly made and carried, the budget of expenditures of Milwaukie for the year 1930 as prepared by the Budget Committee was adopted, and a special tax levied against the taxable property within Milwaukie, Oregon, in the amount of \$11,731.00 for city purposes for the year 1930, which amount to be apportioned as follows: General fund--\$6385.00: Street Fund--\$3292.00: Fire Dept. fund--\$1736.00: Emergency Fund--\$318.00.

Mr. Harvey was present and asked the Council why the Water Supt. would not turn the water on at one of his places until a delinquent water bill against the place was paid. Mr. Harvey was advised that the rules and regulations of the Water Department provided that all water furnished to any premises be charged to the property, and that the Water Supt. had no authority to turn on water until all delinquent bills against the property be paid. Upon motion duly made and carried,

the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the General Fund in favor of the Water fund for \$2000.00 in payment of the loan from the Water fund.
