A special meeting pursuant to the call of Mayor Miller was held on the 30th day of October for the purpose of taking up ordinance No. 334 entitled "An ordinance providing a tax levy on all taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon for city purposes for the year One thousand nine hundred thirty-four (1934). Present: Mayor Miller, Councilmen, Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh; Recorder Adams and Marshal Keck.

The Ordinance was read for the first time and the roll call being taken the following result was had. Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock, and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance Number 335 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 335 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance No. 335 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 335 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes: None. Ordinance, No. 335 passed the third and final reading.

No further business coming before the meeting upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

November 13, 1933.

The three hundred three hundred eightieth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukee was held on the 13th day of November, 1933. Present Mayor Miller; Councilmen, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh; Marshal Keck and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the three hundred seventy ninth regular meeting and the minutes of the special meeting held on October 30, 1933 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was read.

The Mayor stated that there was sufficient money in the water fund to permit the retirement of \$2,000 of Water Bonds, payable June 1, 1934 and suggested the possibility of buying the bonds at once at a discount. The Mayor also pointed out that more than six months' interest would be saved. The Mayor also recommended that Street Bonds falling due in January and February, 1934 be taken up at once in order that savings in the way of interest and discount might be effected.

Upon motion duly made and carried the Mayor and the Recorder were instructed to take up the Water Bonds falling due June 1, 1934 and the Street Bonds payable in January and February, 1934, at once after procuring the best discounts possible.

A communication from the City of Portland relative to the furnishing of fire protection to outside districts was read and ordered filed.

Mr. S. L. Burton was present and requested that the relief committee be allowed the use of the fire hall in East Milwaukie for another year. Upon motion duly made and carried the request was granted.

Mr. Allen of Oswego was present and renewed his request for a franchise to haul garbage in Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried his request was denied.

Mr. Klaus of the Public Sanitary Service, Inc. was present and offered to reduce the charge of his company for collecting and hauling public refuse and garbage from \$10.00 to \$7.00 a month.

The following bills were read and approved by the finance committee and upon motion duly made and carried the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
