COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON NOV. 13, 1934

The three hundred ninety-first regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held in the Council Chambers on the 13th day of November, 1934.

530

Present: Mayor Miller; Councilmen Dean, Dell, Sanders and Walsh; Recorder Adams, Marshal Riley and Water Superintendent Bevington.

The minutes of the three hundred ninetieth regular meeting of the Council and of the special meetings held on the 11th day of October, and the 8th day of November were each read and were approved as read. The Treasurers and Fire Chief's reports were read.

A communication from the Milwaukie local of the National Economic Welfare Federation requesting free water for their club rooms in Milwaukie was read. It was moved by Dean and seconded by Sanders that the request be granted. Carried and so ordered.

The Recorder recommended that some high school boys be deputized to police traffic on the Super-Highway during the periods that school children cross the highway to and from the interurban cars. Discussion was had on the problem of controlling traffic on Super-highway. It was moved by Dean and seconded by Dell that the Recorder get in touch with the State Highway Commission relative to the painting of "Slow Signs" at the two entrances of the highway to the city; the erection of luminous "Slow Signs" at such entrances; and the painting of pedestrian traffic lanes across the highway at the foot of Monroe Street. Carried and so ordered.

Councilmen Dell and Sanders reported on negotiations with the City of Portland relative to the excessive water bills to the City of Portland for July, August, September and October. The report was to the effect that some progress was being made and that a further meeting would be held this week.

Charles Counsel inquired relative to the procedure to be followed relative to the vacation of a portion of the old site of the highway along South Front Street.

The matter of drilling a well for City Water supply purposes was discussed. It was moved by Sanders and seconded by Dell that City Engineer Jones be authorized to make a preliminary investigation relative to the feasibility of drilling such a well. Carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sanders and seconded by Dell that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder draw warrants in payment of the same. Carried and so ordered:

COUNCIL CHAMBERS CITY HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DECEMBER 10, 1934

The three hundred ninety-second regular meeting of the Council was held on the 10th day of December, 1934.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Miller. Present Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the three hundred ninety first regular meeting and of the special meeting held on the 8th day of November, 1934 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was read and ordered filed.
The Fire Chief's report was read and ordered filed.

A communication from Burt S. Cole stating that the city was responsible for damage to plumbing in his home and requesting the city to pay bill of \$1.25 for repairing the damage was read. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the request be denied. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. F.W. Kraemer, Mrs. John Milan, Mr. William Rotter and Mrs. E. Carson appeared before the council asking endorsement of their applications to the State Liquor Control Commission. It was moved by Dean and seconded by Shrock that the request be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Francis Cross and Mrs. E. Babb appeared and requested that a street light be installed on Myrtle Street. The matter was referred to the street committee for investigation and report.

City Engineer W.W. Jones presented his report relative to the feasibility of drilling a well for the city water supply. After considerable discussion it was moved by Dean and seconded by Dell that action on the matter be deferred until the next council takes office. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder read a lease submitted by the Southern Pacific Company relative to the right of way for the footbridge across Kellogg Lake.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Dean that the mayor and recorder be authorized to execute the lease leasing the right of way of the footbridge across Kellogg Lake from the Southern Pacific Company. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Sanders that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder issue warrants covering the same. Motion carried and so ordered.
