

MEETING OF NOVEMBER 13, 1961

COUNCIL CHAMBER

964th MEETING

The nine hundred sixty-fourth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the thirteenth day of November, 1961

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay.

Present: Mayor Earl Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Charles Renard, E. H. Aebi and Theron Sedgwick; City Manager Leonard Mullan, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred sixty-third regular meeting of the Council, held on the ninth day of October, 1961, were approved as written.

A petition, signed by five property owners along 26th Street south of Lake Road, requesting that 26th Street be paved with black-top paving, from Lake Road to its southerly terminus, was read. It was moved by Aebi and seconded by Howard that the following Resolution be adopted.

## RESOLUTION NUMBER 32,1961

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, TO IMPROVE 26th STREET, BY BLACK TOP PAVING FROM LAKE ROAD TO ITS SOUTHERLY TERMINUS.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve 26th Street, by black top paving from Lake Road to its southerly terminus.

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has filed with the City Recorder such plans, specifications and estimate of cost

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for the approximate improvement to accomplish the above and an estimate of the cost of the work to be done, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has filed with the City Recorder such plans, specifications and estimate of cost

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the above mentioned plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer, now on file with the City Recorder, are found to be satisfactory and are hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, does hereby declare its intention and purpose to make such improvement, and the locations and kind of improvement being as follows:

B By black top paving of 26th Street from Lake Road to its southerly terminus; all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder, which plans and specifications are hereby referred to and made a part of this Resolution.

That the district liable to be assessed for the foregoing improvement is as follows:

ALL LOTS OR PARCELS OF LAND LYING WITHIN 100 FEET OF 26th STREET where such black top paving is done.

THAT THE CITY ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE OF THE TOTAL COST OF THIS IMPROVEMENT IS THE SUM OF \$1,650.00.

THAT THE CITY ENGINEER'S ESTIMATED COST PER LINEAL FOOT FOR SUCH IMPROVEMENT IS THE SUM OF \$2.00.


That an assessment will be levied on all lots and parcels of land within such proposed assessment district, in proportion to the amount to which each lot or parcel of land will be benefitted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a written remonstrance against said improvement may be filed with the City Recorder on or before the 11th day of December, 1961.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, shall, within ten days from the passage of this Resolution, give notice of this Resolution by causing to be posted notices with the title "NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT WORK" in three conspicuous places along the said above named Street, which said notice shall contain a copy of this Resolution, and shall specify the time in which a remonstrance against said improvement may be filed with the City Recorder.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary that said improvement be made as soon as possible on account of the bad condition of 26th Street, and in order to take advantage of weather conditions, NOW THEREFORE an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Resolution shall go into full force and effect upon its passage by the City Council and signed by the Mayor.

A petition, signed by eight property owners, requesting that 46th Street, from Railroad Avenue northerly 764 feet, be improved by curbs, pavement and sewer laterals to the property lines where the same were requested, was read. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 33-1961

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, TO IMPROVE 46th STREET, FROM RAILROAD AVENUE NORTHERLY A DISTANCE OF APPROXIMATELY 746 FEET BY BLACK-TOP PAVEMENT, BY CURBS WHERE NECESSARY AND BY INSTALLING SEWER LATERALS FROM THE SANITARY SEWER NOW IN 46th STREET TO THE PROPERTY LINES WHERE SUCH LATERALS ARE REQUESTED BY THE OWNERS OF THE PROPERTIES.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve 46th Street from Railroad Avenue, northerly a distance of approximately 764 feet, by black-topping the same, by installation of curbs along both sides thereof, where the same are necessary and by installing sewer laterals from the sanitary sewer presently in the street to the property lines where the same are requested by the property owners, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie has required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for the improvement to accomplish the above, and an estimate of the cost of the work to be done, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has filed with the City Recorder such plans, specifications and estimates of cost,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon that the above mentioned plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer, now on file with the City Recorder, are found to be satisfactory and are hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, does hereby declare its intention and purpose to make such improvement, and the location and kind of improvement being as follows:

By the paving with asphaltic blacktop and all the things necessary in the construction thereof, all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications hereby referred to and made a part of this Resolution, said pavement to be constructed along 46th Street from its intersection with Railroad Avenue, northerly approximately 764 feet.

By the construction of curbs and all things necessary in the construction of same along both sides of 46th Street where the same are necessary, from its intersection with Railroad Avenue northerly approximately 764 feet,

and by the construction of sewer laterals, and all things necessary in the construction of same, from the sanitary sewer presently in 46th Street, to the property lines where the same are requested to be laid.

THE ENGINEER'S ESTIMATED COST FOR THE COST OF CURBS AND PAVEMENT IS A TOTAL OF \$3,493.00

THE ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE OF COST PER LINEAL FOOT OF PAVING IS \$2.00.

THE ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE OF THE COST PER LINEAL FOOT OF CURBS IS \$1.35

THE ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE OF THE COST PER SEWER CONNECTION IS \$75.00


THAT AN ASSESSMENT WILL BE LEVIED on all lots or parcels of land abutting the said portion of 46th Street for the curbs and pavement.

THAT AN ASSESSMENT WILL BE LEVIED on all lots or parcels of land along said portion of said street for the sewer connection laterals WHERE THE SAME HAVE BEEN REQUESTED by the owner of such lots or parcels of land.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, shall within ten days from the passage of this Resolution, give notice of the passage of this Resolution by causing to be posted notices with the title "NOTICE OF STREET AND SEWER IMPROVEMENT WORK in three conspicuous places along side above named street, which said notice shall contain a copy of this Resolution, and shall specify the time in which a remonstrance against said proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder.

AND WHEREAS it is necessary that said improvement be made as soon as possible on account of weather conditions NOW THEREFORE an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Resolution shall go into full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.

Ordinance Number 860 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that Ordinance No. 860 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

## A P R O C L A M A T I O N

WHEREAS the United Nations has clearly demonstrated its capacity to act as a force for peace and human advancement, and has provided a dynamic spirit which is leading the nations of the world along the road to human progress; and

WHEREAS the United Nations is available to assist all nations and peoples in their efforts to combat hunger, disease, and despair; and

WHEREAS the City of Milwaukie, Oregon strongly supports the United Nations, the Charter of which is rooted in ideals and aspirations which we share with freedom-loving people in all parts of the world; and

WHEREAS the City of Milwaukie, Oregon considers that this world organization is an indispensable instrument of international peace, economic improvement, and social development, and that any attempt to destroy it would be a blow aimed directly at the independence and security of nations, large and small; and

WHEREAS the General Assembly of the United Nations has resolved that October twenty-fourth, the anniversary of the coming into force of the United Nations Charter, should be dedicated each year to making known the purposes, principles, and accomplishments of the United Nations:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EARL M. CLAY, Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, do hereby urge the citizens of this City to observe Tuesday, October 24, 1961, as United Nations Day by means of community programs which will demonstrate their faith in the United Nations and contribute to a better understanding of its aims, problems, and accomplishments.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon to be affixed.

DONE at the City of Milwaukie, Oregon this eighteenth day of October in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and sixty-one, and of the Independence of the United States of American the one hundred and eighty-fifth.
