COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, NOVEMBER 23, 1936

The four hundred thirty-second regular meeting of the Council was held on the 23rd day of November, 1936.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Bell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Marshal Riley, Water Superintendent Bevington, and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

Mrs. Rose Eckenberger and Miss Daisy Evans appeared before the Council and stated that they had collected \$55.00 with which to maintain the Library pending the approval of a continuance of the W. P. A. project for maintenance of the Library.

Mr. John Beakey, Safety Supervisor for the State Highway Commission appeared and discussed the matter of regulating traffic on the Super-Highway. It was decided to meet with the Highway Commission in order to discuss measures to be taken to regulate the traffic on the Super-Highway.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Mayor and Recorder arrange for the payment of \$7,350.87 to the Howard - Cooper Corporation on or before December 9, 1936, in payment for the Sea-raves Fire Truck. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Wills and seconded by Dell that the offer of School District Number One to give the City the school cafeteria building be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that the Water Superintendent be authorized to arrange for the moving of the school Cafeteria Building from the school grounds to the situs of the large deep-well water pump at a cost of not to exceed \$150.00. Motion carried and so ordered.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, DECEMBER 7, 1936

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 7th day of December, 1936 pursuant to the call of Mayor Sanders for the purpose of transacting such business as might demand the attention of the Council. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Recorder Adams.

The matter of securing insurance for the Fire Truck was taken up. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that the Recorder contact the Farmer's Mutual Inter-Insurance Exchange in reference to insurance for the Fire Truck and that if such company would not handle the insurance then to contact C. F. Richardson in reference to such insurance and place insurance on the truck immediately covering public liability, property damage, collision, fire, and theft. Motion carried and so ordered.

The following requests for the endorsement of the Council to applications to the Oregon Liquor Commission for licenses were submitted:

- That of Ernest McLaughlin for a Retail Beer License and Package Store Class "A" Beer License.
- That of Jack Milan for a Retail Beer License and Package Store Class "A" Beer License.
- That of Wm. Roetter for a Retail Beer License and Package Store Class "A" Beer License.
- That of F. W. Kramer for a Winery License.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that the Council favorably endorse each of the applications and that the Recorder execute such endorsements on behalf of the Council. Motion Carried and so ordered.

A communication from Father Bernards offering to pay up the sewer assessments on lots Tscharner Addition at once providing the interest was waived was read. Father Bernards stated that he had paid a ten percent penalty on the assessments when others had not done so and asked that the interest be waived as an off-set. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the offer of Father Bernards be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder was instructed to write the School Board of School District Number One and thank them for the donation of the old school cafeteria building and also to write a letter of thanks to the Howard-Cooper Corporation for the dinner tendered by the Corporation to the members of the Fire Department and City Council.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.
