Upon motion of Councilman Counsell seconded by Councilman Albee and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw an ordinance increasing the annual liquor license from \$800.00 to \$1000.00 per annum. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by Councilman King and carried, the Council went into a committee of the whole to consider the tax levy for the ensuing year. Moved and seconded that the Committee arise. Carried. The Committee reported that it would recommend that the Council levy a 8 mill tax for the coming year. Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the committee was adopted. Moved by Councilman Mitchell and seconded by Councilman Albee that the Council levy a 8 mill tax for the year 1914. Carried.

Upon motion of Councilman Hoeding seconded by Councilman King and carried the Recorder was instructed to get a statement of the road money due Milwaukie from the County for the years 1911 & 1912, and make the proper demand from the County Court for the same.

Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by Councilman King and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Foster Road Fund in favor of Louis C. Kelsey for \$62.92, the balance due him for engineering services on Foster Road. Upon motion of Councilman Albee seconded by Councilman Mitchell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to readvertise for bids for the improvement of DRWITT Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the meeting adjourned until Friday November 28th, 1913.
