MEETING OF NOVEMBER 25, 1940

The five hundred twenty-fifth meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 25th day of November, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts. Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rivers and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon and Recorder Adams.

Lulu Tautfest requested permission of the Council to establish a community Christmas tree on Main Street between Scott and Harrison Streets. Mayor Roberts suggested that she endeavor to secure the permission of private property owners of adjacent property for location of the tree on private property.

It was moved by Rivers and seconded by Mourer that the Council endorse the following applications to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission for licenses:

Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rivers that the Recorder be directed to write a letter to the Board of Union High School District No. 5, thanking them for their cooperation and financial support in reference to the repair of 22nd Street and Willard Street. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rudder and seconded by Gillem that Fire Chief Lewellyn be authorized to purchase a hydrant pump for Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00). Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rudder and seconded by Gillem that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants covering payment of the same:

MEETING OF DECEMBER 9, 1940

The five hundred twenty-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 9th day of December, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts. Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington; Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the five hundred twenty-fourth and five hundred twenty-fifth regular meetings of the Council, held respectively on the 11th and 25th days of November, 1940, were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed. The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Rudder and seconded by Gillem that the Council favorably endorse the application of Ernest McLaughlin for a retail store class "B" license from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rudder and seconded by Gillem that the Council favorably endorse the application of Safeway Stores, Inc., for a package store class "A" license from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Mourer that the steel cabinet in the Treasurer's office be sold to C. F. Richardson for the sum of \$20.00. The motion carried and was so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Mourer that \$212.67 of the police fund be transferred to the street fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

Harry Dean appeared before the Council and requested that some arrangement be made for the heating of the assembly room in the basement of the city hall. It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rudder that the Mayor be authorized to investigate the matter and report to the Council the most
