

MEETING OF DECEMBER 8, 1958

929th MEETING

The nine hundred twenty-ninth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, was held on the eighth day of December, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Klein; Manager Burdick. Absent: Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred twenty-eighth regular meeting of the Council, held on the tenth day of November, 1958, were approved as written.

A proposed Ordinance providing for a proposed right-of-way franchise to lay track line of railway along McBrod Avenue, was laid before the Council by Fred Schlaf of Portland Traction Company. This matter was discussed and some changes were made in the proposed Ordinance, after which it was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Clay that Ordinance Number 738 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 738, AN ORDINANCE providing for a franchise, right and privilege to PORTLAND TRACTION COMPANY, and its successors and assigns, to lay down, relay, construct, reconstruct, move, remove, locate, relocate, lease, repair, maintain, equip, operate, have, hold, use and enjoy a drill track line of railway, with all necessary overhead and underground equipment, including telephone, telegraph and electric wires and poles, switches and stations, and all reasonable and convenient equipment and appurtenances, and to run and operate cars and trains and carry freight, mail, baggage and express thereon, in, over, along and upon and all being on the street known as McBrod Avenue, in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon., was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 738 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Mr. Emelee, of the Ardenwald Stages, came before the Council and requested a renewal of his Franchise to operate busses in Milwaukie. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Sedgwick that the Ardenwald Stages Inc. be granted exclusive franchise to pick up and discharge passengers within the City of Milwaukie, provided they file with the City Recorder their schedule of fares and routes; the franchise to be terminable at the pleasure of the City Council but not to extend beyond December 31, 1962. Motion carried and so ordered.

Applications for recommendation of renewals of liquor licenses were laid before the Council by the following dealers and distributors: Otis Fleishman, Lew's Super Market, Elks Lodge No. 2032, Mac's Pit and Ski Room. There was no Police report against any of these applicants. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Mortensen that recommendations for renewals of liquor licenses be granted as follows:

Motion carried and so ordered.

A deed from Jack Shigeru Yoshitomi, to the City of Milwaukie, for land which has been used as a part of Washington Street, from about 33rd Street to 35th Street, was presented to the Council. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Klein that the Council accept this deed. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from Milwaukie Planning Commission, in which they recommend that the Council take the necessary steps to acquire platted property now under the waters of Kellogg Lake, from the Southern Pacific right-of-way northerly to Adams Street and from Main Street to McLoughlin Blvd., was read. This matter was referred to the City Attorney.
