

## MEETING OF DECEMBER 10, 1956

COUNCIL CHAMBER

905th MEETING

The nine hundred fifth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukee, was held on the tenth day of December, 1956.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan, Councilmen Clay, Perkins, Shook and Klein, Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred fourth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twelfth day of November, 1956, were approved as written.

Mr. A.J. Emele, of the Ardenwald Stages, came before the Council and requested a renewal of his Franchise to operate Busses in Milwaukee. There was considerable discussion during which the possibility of Rose City Transit Co. operating busses through Milwaukee on McLoughlin Blvd. was proposed. Also the matter of transfer privileges from one Buss line to the other, was discussed. Mr. Emele explained his routes and his schedule to the Council. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that the Ardenwald Stages Inc. be granted exclusive franchise to pick up and discharge passengers within the City of Milwaukee, provided they file with the City Recorder their schedules of fares and routes; the franchise to be terminable at the pleasure of the City Council but not to extend beyond December 31, 1958. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of the 34th Street curb and sidewalk improvement was again laid before the Council and reviewed by them. Manager Burdick reported that he had asked Perkins Bros. and Cooley-Wolsborn Construction Co. to view the curbs and walks and estimate the cost of repairs to bring them up to a condition acceptable to the City, and that both firms had estimated the cost below \$800.00. There was considerable discussion on the matter. It was moved by Perkins and seconded by Shook that inasmuch as it appears to the Council that all negotiations with the citizens involved in the 34th Street improvement by curbs and sidewalks has been unavailing and that it would be improbable to reach any agreement that would be satisfactory to all concerned, that therefore, all action taken by the Council, in this matter, be revoked and that an assessment for the full cost of the improvement be undertaken, and that the City make the necessary repairs to bring the walks and curbs up to the standard acceptable to the City Manager and the City Engineer. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 658 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that Ordinance No. 658 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that recommendation for renewal of the following liquor permits be granted.

Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Burdick read a report from Marvin Runyan, of Stevens and Thompson, Consulting Engineers, which showed the progress of work done on sewers and lift station at the Keil-Walsh Sewer project. The report recommended that Don Thornton, Contractor, be paid \$2,317.48 due him at this time. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that Don Thornton, Contractor, be paid \$2,317.48 as recommended by the Engineer. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Police Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Attorney Sheldahl reported the status of the Leo Fontana and the George Kirkpatrick cases, both of which are in the Clackamas County Courts.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Clay that the following bills be approved and paid.
