

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DEC. 3RD. 1914.

An adjourned meeting of the regular one hundred fifty-second meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen King, Mitchell, Loeding, Albee and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Marshal Reed and Treasurer Polstad. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 114 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 114 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance no. 114 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Albee and Counsell. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 114 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance no. 114 was taken up for the third and final reading, and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 114 passed.

Ordinance No. 121 entitled, "An ordinance establishing the grades on 21st Street from the South line of Washington Street to the northeasterly line of Lake Road," was read and a copy ordered posted as required by the City Charter. A petition to change the Arc light from 31st street to 31st and Sellwood streets was read and referred to the Light Committee.

The application of A. F. Eckerle for a transfer of the Pool Room License was read and referred to Licensee Committee. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Treasurer was instructed to accept a warrant for \$1062.00 held by the Bonnet Estate against the Town of Milwaukie, toward the payment of the assessment against the Bonnet Estate for the improvement of Harrison Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to confer with the First State Bank of Milwaukie and the Lumbermens National Bank in regard to the interest that they would pay on the money derived from the sale of the water bonds with full authority to deposit the money in the bank which would pay the best rate of interest and give the best security.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the meeting adjourned.

Eckerle, as petitioned for. Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the License Committee was adopted. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Daly to submit a contract to the Council for furnishing Bull Run Water to the town on the terms and conditions previously submitted to the Council.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the petition for an arc light at the intersection of Harrison & Ruckeye Streets was allowed, and the Recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co to install said lights and make the changes recommended by the Light Committee.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned until the 9th day of December, 1914.
