An adjourned meeting of the one hundred fifty-third regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Presiding Councilman Mitchell. Present, councilmen, Mitchell, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Polstad and Marshal Reed. The objections of Mr. Ameele and Mrs. Murndorff to the proposed assessment of their property for the improvement of Monroe Street was read and referred to the Street Committee. The Street Committee reported that the proposed assessment of Mr. Ameele's and Mrs. Murndorff's property for the improvement of Monroe Street was fair and equitable and in accordance with the City Charter, and that they would recommend that the assessment stand as proposed. Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the Street Committee was adopted. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 120, entitled, "An Ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of Monroe Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the east line of Main Street to the West line of Shindler Street, and declaring an emergency", was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following results: Ayes, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 120 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 120 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, King, Counsell, Loeding and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 120 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 120 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 120 passed. The matter of the acceptance of the completion of Laurel Avenue was taken up. The objections of J. R. Kelso to the acceptance of the same was read and referred to the Street Committee. The Street Committee recommended that the improvement of Laurel Avenue be accepted as the same had been completed in accordance with the plans and specifications and the contract therefor. Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the Street Committee was adopted. Upon motion duly made and carried, the improvement of Laurel Avenue was accepted. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
