Upon motion of Councilman Stockton seconded by Councilman Knight and carried, the recorder was instructed to notify the property owners on the south side of Jefferson Street between Front and main streets of the dangerous and unsafe condition of the side walk along their property and to notify them to repair the side walk and put it in a safe condition.

Upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by councilman Lehman and carried, the Recorder was instructed to write to D. W. Campbell of the Southern Pacific Company and notify him that unless the Company put in the overhead crossing at Foster Road immediately, the Council would take the necessary action to compel the Company to do so.

No further business coming before the Council moved and second that the Council adjourn. Carried.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DECEMBER, 10TH, 1912.

The one hundred twenty-ninth (129) regular meeting of the Town Council of the town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Streib. Present, <sup>Mayor Streib</sup> Councilmen Kelso, Knight and Lehman, Recorder Mathews and Marshall Davis.

The minutes of the one hundred twenty-eight (128) regular meeting held on the 12th day of November, 1912 were read and approved as read.

Upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Lehman and carried, the following bills were allowed and the recorder was ordered to draw warrants on the general fund for the payment of the same:

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the bill of W. H. Counsell for material and labor on Fourth, Oak and Harrison streets was postponed for consideration until the special meeting to be held Friday the 13th day of December, 1912.

Mr. Burns of the Southern Pacific Company presented to the Council plans for the steel overhead crossing to be placed over Foster Road by the Company. He stated that the steel crossing had been ordered and would be put in within sixty days.

A proposed agreement extending the time of the Rockolite Contracting Company for completing the improvement on Foster Road was read and upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Kelso and carried, the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to enter into said agreement in behalf of Milwaukie, by signing and affixing the Town seal thereto.

The fourth partial estimate of the work done by the Rockolite Contracting Company to the amount of \$4365.50, as reported by the City engineer, was read, and upon motion of Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Lehman and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Foster Road improvement fund for the same, but the warrant not to be delivered until the street is properly rolled and cleaned.

Upon motion of Councilman Kelso seconded by Councilman Lehman and carried, the Recorder was ordered to notify the Portland Railway Light and Power Company to change the position of the light at front and jefferson streets, and to install additional lights in the following places, to-wit: One light on Foster Road, 1200 feet past of the present light; One on the corner of Fourth and oak Streets; One at Front and Jackson streets; one just east of the driveway to the Milwaukie Tavern and one 1200 feet North of Harrison street on the Willsburg Road.

Moved by Councilman Lehman and seconded by Councilman Kelso that a tax of three mills be levied on the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie for general town purposes. Carried.

Moved by Councilman Knight and seconded by Councilman Lehman that the Town borrow the sum of \$1000.00 from the Washington Street improvement fund and loan the same to the general fund of Milwaukie. Carried.

The proposed amendments to the City Charter prepared by the committee were presented to the Council and read, and the recorder was instructed to have the City Attorney pass on the same.

No further business coming before the Council moved and seconded that the Council adjourn. Carried.
