

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE OREGON, NOV. 19TH. 1931.

An adjourned meeting of the three hundred fifty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 19th. day of November, 1931.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Bevington and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. Upon motion duly made and carried, the estimated budget of expenditures of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the year 1932, as prepared by the Budget Committee, was approved and adopted as the budget of Milwaukie for the year 1932.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF MILWAUKIE that a special tax of \$10,870.00 be and hereby is levied against the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, for city purposes for the year 1932, and to be apportioned among the several funds as set forth and itemized in the estimated budget of expenditures of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the year 1932, heretofore approved by the Council.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Greenwell was granted permission to dump 100 piling in the River near the foot of Jefferson Street without putting up a bond to protect the city. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DEC. 14TH. 1931.

The three hundred fifty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 14th. day of December, 1931. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Bevington and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fifty-sixth regular meeting of the Council held on the 9th. day of November, 1931, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the ~~regular~~ three hundred fifty-sixth regular meeting, held on the 19th. day of November, 1931, were read and approved as read.

The proposed contract between the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the City of Portland, Oregon, for furnishing Bull Run water to the City of Milwaukie, for a period of two years from the 1st day of December, 1931, was read and the same being satisfactory to the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to execute said contract on behalf of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and deliver the same to the City of Portland, Oregon.

Mr. Cole was present and requested a permit to erect a temporary wooden garage with in the business district. Upon motion duly made and carried, the request of Mr. Cole was granted. A petition requesting the Council to reduce the water rates was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the matter was referred to the Water Committee for consideration, the Committee to make a report of their recommendations at the next regular meeting of the Council. TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JAN. 12TH, 1932.

The three hundred fifty-eighth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 12th day of January, 1932. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Shindler, Dean, Bevington and Dell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Wiseman and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fifty-seventh regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th day of December, 1931, were read and approved as read. Mr. Ramsey representing the Milwaukie Business Men's Club was present and advised the Council that if the City would purchase the material that the Relief Committee would construct a band stand and parking railing along Main Street South of Washington Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council appropriated \$100.00 out of the General fund to purchase the material for a band stand and a parking railing, and the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the General fund for \$100.00 in favor of the Relief Committee. Councilman Dean of the Water Committee reported that the Committee had given serious consideration to the matter of reducing water rates within and without Milwaukie and after an investigation had found that the water rates of Milwaukie were lower than the rates of any water district outside of Portland, and if the City of Milwaukie intended to pay the outstanding water bonds when due and make any improvements to the water system it would be impossible to reduce the water rates, and that the Water Committee would recommend that the present water rates be not reduced. Upon motion duly made and carried the recommendation of the Water Committee was accepted and approved. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the General fund for \$1850.00 in favor of the Water Dept. in payment of the balance due the Water Dept., fund from the general fund for loan. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Treasurer were instructed to take up \$5000.00 of the outstanding water bonds. The request of Mrs. Johnson that there be no charge for water furnished at house No. 1806 - 30th Street, on the account of sickness was granted. The Recorder was instructed to notify the Southern Pacific Company to install wig wag signals at railroad crossings at Monroe and Washington Streets and to place planking between its railroad tracks where the same crosses the streets. The Street Supt. was instructed to make the necessary repairs on 28th Street and Monroe Street. The application of O. H. Smith for a position as city plumber was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council donated the sum of \$3.00 to J. A. Keck to help pay his expenses in attending the Northwest Police officers Association at McMinnville, Oregon, on the 20th day of January, 1932. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that gravel be placed on the south side of Harrison Street between 34th Street and 37th Street.
