

on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, with Mr. Scott for the improvement of DeWitt Street. Ordinance No. 98 entitled "An Ordinance to license, tax, regulate and restrain barrooms, road-houses, drinking shops or other places where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors are sold, or kept for sale, or in any manner disposed of, and to regulate the disposal of the same; to define the duties and responsibilities of saloon-keepers, bartenders and all dealers in spirituous, malt or vinous liquors, and for the repeal of ordinance No. 69; and providing a punishment for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance, was ordered posted as required by the City Charter. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Laurel Avenue Fund for \$440.00 in favor of the Southern Pacific Company for the land appropriated for the extension of Laurel Avenue. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to notify the property owners along the streets to remove the dirt from the sidewalks in front of their property, and if they fail to do so the council will cause the same to be removed, and declare a lien against the property for the cost of the same. Upon motion duly made and seconded the meeting adjourned until the 26th day of December, 1913, subject during the mean time to the call of the Mayor.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DEC. 15TH. 1913.

A call meeting of the regular one hundred forty-first meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The third monthly estimate of the City Engineer of the work done by the Montague-O'Reilly Company on Front Street was read as was also their bill for extra work perform on said street for the months of Sept. & October. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant of the Front Street fund for \$4580.00 in favor of the Montague-O'Reilly Company for work done on Front Street, and also a warrant on the same fund in favor of Montague-O'Reilly Company for extra material and work performed on Front Street during Sept. & October.

Upon motion of Councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw contracts for the property owners along Front Street south of Jefferson Street to sign, wherein they waive the construction of wooden sidewalks along their property and agree to construct cement sidewalk along their property on or before three yaers.

Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by council Albee and carried, ordinance No. 97 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, councilmen, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent Councilman Mitchell. Ordinance No. 97 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 97 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Councilmen, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent, councilman Mitchell. Ordinance No. 97 passed the second reading. Upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Counsell, and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No.97 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, councilmen, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent, councilman Mitchell. Ordinance No. 97 passed. The Street Committee, to whom the matter of the assessment of the J. M. Stuckey Lot was referred, recommended that the City pay one third of the assessment as the lot was not liable for the full assessment. Upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Counsell and carried the recommendation was accepted.

Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the meeting adjourned until the 26th day of December, 1913.
